RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those:

- (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;
- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.

Readings for the Sixth Sunday after Pentecost

The Old Testament Reading is Isaiah 55:10-13

"For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth. making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty. but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it. For you shall go out in joy and be led forth in peace; the mountains and the hills before you shall break forth into singing, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands. Instead of the thorn shall come up the cypress; instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle; and it shall make a name for the LORD, an everlasting sign that shall not be cut off."

The Epistle is Romans 8:12-17

So then, brothers, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!" The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

The Gospel is Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23

That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea. And great crowds gathered about him, so that he got into a boat and sat down. And the whole crowd stood on the beach. And he told them many things in parables, saying: "A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seeds fell along the path, and the birds came and devoured them. Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and immediately they sprang up, since they had no depth of soil, but when the sun rose they were scorched. And since they had no root, they withered away. Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Other seeds fell on good soil and produced grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. He who has ears, let him hear." ...

"Hear then the parable of the sower: When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what has been sown in his heart. This is what was sown along the path. As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy, yet he has no root in himself, but endures for a while, and when tribulation or persecution arises on account of the word, immediately he falls away. As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and it proves unfruitful. As for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it. He indeed bears fruit and yields, in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty."

THANKS to everyone who has donated diapers. So far we have collected 2,200 diapers. We are still in need of newborn, and sizes 2, 5, and 6. AROUND THE NATION COVID-19 is still troubling many states. As of this writing, I don't know if we'll be able to move to Stage 5 on July 5th as scheduled. Regardless, let us continue to use caution as we gather; we must continue to love our neighbors. 1) Hoosiers 65 and older and those with known high-risk medical conditions should adhere to social distancing guidelines and remain cautious at work and in their communities; 2) Face coverings are optional, although *the Governor is promoting "Mask Up, Hoosiers!"*; 3) *Maintain social distancing guidelines in social settings — we're doing this still in church; try to offset yourselves* 4) social gatherings permitted in groups greater than 250. 5) Nursing homes visitation continues to be evaluated; K-12 schools operations to be determined.

CONGREGATIONAL ASSEMBLY We're working on filling important positions on councils and producing the budget. If asked to serve, please prayerfully consider it. And please continue to offer up your gifts to the Lord regularly and cheerfully. The Assembly is being planned for July 26 — lots of business.

MEMORY VERSE CHALLENGE How did you do on last week's challenge verse? This week's challenge verse is part of our funeral liturgy — Rom 6:3-4—"Do you know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into his death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life." Last week's verse was Matt 11:28.

UPDATE FROM SHEILA: Maurice was released from the hospital after 73 days. He had been on a ventilator for a month, in the ICU for a month, and in rehab most recently. He had been unable to walk at all and even now can stand with a walker for only 10 minutes at a time. He had just about every major organ except his heart and hearing affected. His appendix, gallbladder, and eyesight were all affected. His right hand at this point isn't working well, and he was to start therapy on his hand this week. 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What Doctor Luther Says:

About the Christian's Response to Sonship

St. Paul, as was his custom, taught first the great chief articles of Christian doctrine—the law, sin, and faith, how we are to be justified before God and live eternally. As you have often heard and still hear every day, namely, that there are two points to be taught and preached: first we must see to it that faith in Christ is rightly preached, and second, that the fruits and good works are rightly taught and practiced.

Faith requires that we know what sin is, what the law is, what death is, and what it does, and also how we return to life and abide in it. This is the way Paul teaches in all his epistles; first concerning faith in Christ. First he plants the good tree, just as anybody who wants to have a good garden must have good trees. This is what Paul does; first he sets out the wild trees [cf. Rom. 11:24] and teaches how we should become good trees, that is, how we are to believe and be saved.

This he has been describing up to this point in the twelfth chapter. From here to the end of the epistle he teaches the fruits of faith, in order that we may not be false Christians, who have only the name of Christian, but rather real, true believers. This is the preaching concerning good works, which God commands ... Here he is teaching concerning the works of Christians. Now, he is saying, now that we have been made rich through Christ the Lord, transferred from the dominion of the devil and the world to his kingdom [cf. Col. 1:13], that is, into the church of Christ; now that we have the Word and the sacraments, now that we have been baptized, now that we are sons and heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ the Son of God [cf. Rom. 8:17], who has given us eternal life, now it is necessary that we look to and really devote ourselves to the glorious calling and gifts.

Zion Stay-Safe Rules

- * If you are sick, GO HOME or to the doctor.
- If you are over 65 or immunocompromised, be especially careful. Still follow the rules.
- Masks are optional in Back on Track Stage 4.5, but they are recommended in the pews because of prolonged exposure. The Governor is promoting "Mask Up, Hoosiers!"

- Holy Communion will continue with stations until the virus is contained. Individual cups are offered for the blood of Christ.
