
- (a) who have been baptized in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;

#### **Readings for the Fourth Sunday of Easter**

#### The First Reading is Acts 4:1-12

As they were speaking to the people, the priests and the captain of the temple and the Sadducees came upon them, greatly annoyed because they were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead. And they arrested them and put them in custody until the next day, for it was already evening. But many of those who had heard the word believed, and the number of the men came to about five thousand.

On the next day their rulers and elders and scribes gathered together in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest and Caiaphas and John and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. And when they had set them in the midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, if we are being examined today concerning a good deed done to a crippled man, by what means this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead—by him this man is standing before you well. This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone. And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

#### The Epistle is 1 John 3:16-24

By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers. But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth.

By this we shall know that we are of the truth and reassure our heart before him; for whenever our heart condemns us, God is greater than our heart, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our heart does not condemn us, we have confidence before God; and whatever we ask we receive from him, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him. And this is his commandment, that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. Whoever keeps his commandments abides in him, and he in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit whom he has given us.

#### The Gospel is John 10:11-18

[Jesus said:] "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep. And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life that I may take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from my Father."

**PARENTS WITH LITTLE ONES**, there are booster seats available for you in the old narthex (entryway). Ask or pick one up for your toddler to help them sit and see.

MEN OF ZION are studying the prophet Zechariah. Join in on Wednesday mornings at 9:30 AM.

**COVID PROTOCOLS** for Zion remain unchanged for now, but I plan to make changes soon. The Elders will be looking at the planned changes and giving their counsel on them. Check our posted protocols, if you're unsure of the current protocols. I'm planning for a change starting May 9. In the meantime, we must remain vigilant. We are still urging masks in the pews for the sake of the unvaccinated, even by the vaccinated, if you are able — we have never mandated mask-wearing; and we always promote good hand hygiene. Please do your part.

**COVID-19 UPDATE AT ZION:** Allen County remains in yellow with the same twomeasure metric of 1.5. Last week, I suggested we could go back into orange, given our trajectory, but that upward slope seems to have turned downward. We've had some daily positives back below 5%. That's good news, and gives me some comfort about our upcoming move to return to normal. Hospitalizations and ICU bed usage for COVID in District 3 have leveled off. And there has been no spike in COVID-related deaths Thanks be to God. I continue to urge you get vaccinated, unless there is a health reason you cannot. *Hoosiers 16 and older are now eligible*. The state has fully vaccinated 29.9% of the population; Allen County has vaccinated 29.3% of the eligible population. Troubling to me are the 32% of Hoosiers 80+ who have elected not to be vaccinated, given that 51.8% of the Hoosier deaths were those 80 and over (25.8% of those 70+). Unless there is a medical reason not to be vaccinated, odds are much better for you if you get the shot than if you get the virus.

**MEMORY VERSE CHALLENGE** How did you do on last week's challenge verses? In this week's memory verse St. Paul reminds us that flesh dies, but faith leads to life: 1 Corinthians 15:22 "For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive." Last week's verse was John 14:19



# What Doctor Luther Says:

About the Word that Gathers the Shepherd's Flock Now see what a commotion this little psalm (117) causes throughout the world—how it storms and rages among idols! The world has always been full of idolatry, factions, and error, so that even the Romans, the cleverest and mightiest of all, had more than a hundred gods. The world is divided into countless errors, and yet this psalm dares include these thoughts and boldly declare that all such factions and idolatries must cease, and that all the heathen must turn to one faith and praise and honor one God. Through the Word of God there is to come out of such a variety of worship one harmonious flock under one Shepherd (John 10:16). It is truly wonderful that a human heart can dare conceive of this, believe in it, and firmly prophesy that it will happen, especially when one considers how hard the devil will oppose, resist, and block it with all the power and wisdom of this world, so that it would seem to be a sheer impossibility. Nevertheless, the psalmist has the courage to say it, and in spite of all it has come to pass. Both are great miracles: that a man should believe this, and that it should actually happen.

From this we see that the Word of God must be an almighty power of God (Rom. 1:16). It has cleaned up the idolatry, sectarianism, and error that then prevailed in the world so thoroughly that not a shred remains, despite the fact that emperors, princes, wise men, saints, all devils, and the whole world raged with such stubborn violence against it. The world has never taken it upon itself to fight idolatry. It can put up with any amount of error. But when God's Word comes, the world goes mad and refuses to stand for it. The world has had to stand for it, however, and has even been thoroughly defeated. This is the greatest work God has done on earth .... *Luther's Works*, 14:10.

## **Zion Stay-Safe Protocols**
