- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.

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### **Readings for the Sixth Sunday of Easter**

### The First Reading is Acts 10:34-48

Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (he is Lord of all), you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, but God raised him on the third day and made him to appear, not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. And he commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word. And the believers from among the circumcised who had come with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out even on the Gentiles. For they were hearing them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter declared, "Can anyone withhold water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked him to remain for some days.

### The Epistle is 1 John 5:1-8

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the Father loves whomever has been born of him. By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome. For everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world— our faith. Who is it that overcomes the world except the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

This is he who came by water and blood—Jesus Christ; not by the water only but by the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one who testifies, because the Spirit is the truth. For there are three that testify: the Spirit and the water and the blood; and these three agree.

### The Gospel is John 15:9-17

[Jesus said,] "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, that someone lays down his life for his friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you. You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you. These things I command you, so that you will love one another."

**HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY** to all mothers and grandmothers with special prayers for those women who have been unable to have children. God bless you and those whom you influence.

**DIAPER DRIVE COLLECTION TIME:** We are beginning the collection for diapers in order to get ready for the August diaper drive. During these urgent times we would like to collect at least 8,500 diapers (similar to last year). Please help out with this act of love to our neighbors.

**PARENTS WITH LITTLE ONES**, there are booster seats available for you in the old narthex (entryway). Ask or pick one up for your toddler to help them sit and see.

**MEN OF ZION** are studying the prophet Zechariah. Join in on Wednesday mornings at 9:30 AM. We probably have a couple more sessions before summer break.

**COVID PROTOCOLS** are changing this Sunday. See the bulletin insert. We will return to the altar rail to receive the Holy Communion, kneeling if you are able. Some distance may be left between families. Ushers will bring the people in the transepts forward first (leave a place for Mike and Sarah in the first table to be served). If you desire still an individual cup for the blood of Christ, pick one up from one of the "source trays" near the center aisle. You will be served with the pouring chalice. Place your used cup in the "used tray" at one of the side aisles. The persons seated in the nave will be served next with a similar procedure.

**COVID-19 UPDATE AT ZION:** Allen County remains in yellow with the same twomeasure metric of 1.5 ... again. We're hovering at around the 5% - 6% range for average daily positives. It would be nice to get that under 5%. Similarly, the number of positives per 100,000 in Allen County remain high, around 120. That needs to come down. Hospitalizations and ICU bed usage for COVID in District 3 have leveled off, and there has been no spike in COVID-related deaths Thanks be to God. Allen County is doing pretty well on vaccinations at 36.1% fully vaccinated. Still, the rate of people getting their first vaccinations is going down, and that is worrisome. There are still a lot of Hoosiers left in the county needing vaccinated. If you haven't yet, please do so, if you can. *Hoosiers 16 and older are now eligible.* Unless there is a medical reason for you not to be vaccinated, odds are much better for you if you get the shot than if you get the virus.

**MEMORY VERSE CHALLENGE** In this week's memory verse St. John teaches us that Jesus the Word is the source of life and our enlightenment: John 1:4 "In him was life, and the life was the light of men." Last week's verse was 1 Corinthians 15:57.

# What Doctor Luther Says:

About Our Reconciliation — Christ's Work Not Ours 16. You did not choose Me, but I chose you ...

Here Christ Himself explains how He wants the words "No longer do I call you servants, but I call you My friends" to be understood. He says: "This friendship — the fact that I call you My friends —you do not have from yourselves; you have it because I chose you as friends through My suffering and death, and because I acknowledge you as My friends. Therefore you have no reason to boast, as though you had merited this from Me and were really worthy of it. In brief, you are friends because I chose and accepted you, who were by nature nothing but enemies. Otherwise you would know nothing of Me or of God. But now you are friends solely because I loved you so dearly and meant so well by you that I redeemed you and placed you into eternal life. ... here Christ calls those friends who never did Him a favor, yes, never knew Him but are poor, wretched sinners, even God's enemies, whose sins and death He takes upon Himself.

This blasts and condemns all the presumption toward God of the pseudo saints, who want to do and merit enough to reconcile God and to make Him their friend. For what else is this but to presume that they do the choosing and initiate the friendship; that their merits take precedence and that God's grace comes hobbling along behind; that it is not He who chooses us, but that we seek Him and want to make Him our friend, so that we can boast of having conferred some favor on Him? This is what all the world does; all the Jewish, Turkish, and papist saints undertake to earn God's grace through their works, which are to precede grace. But here we read: "You did not choose Me; that is, you are not My friends by reason of anything that you have done; you are friends by reason of what I have done. ..."

- Those who have NOT been vaccinated are urged to wear a mask while in the pews for your own protection and the protection of others. Those who ARE FULLY vaccinated may wear a mask if you desire to do so; you are no longer being urged to do so.
- Practice social distancing in the pews according to your comfort level.
- Holy Communion will be served at the altar rail again, kneeling if you are able. Individual cups continue to be offered for the blood of Christ. Pick up an individual cup from the "source tray" on the small table to indicate your desire to drink the blood of Christ in this way. Put your used cup in the "used tray" as you return to your pew by one of the side aisles.
- We are greeting with a shake of the hands. We can still do a fist or arm bump if you desire it.
- Some snacks will return to the Great Hall to encourage socializing after the Divine Service.
- These protocols will, hopefully, be able to be loosened further or done away with soon.
