As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those:

- (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;
- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.

The Congregation rises, turns towards the entrance of the nave, and faces the Cross of Christ, the reminder of Christ's promise to come and dwell among His people as they are gathered in His name.





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Readings for the Seventh Sunday of Easter

The First Reading is Acts 1:12-26

Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey away. And when they had entered, they went up to the upper room, where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot and Judas the son of James. All these with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers.

In those days Peter stood up among the brothers (the company of persons was in all about 120) and said, "Brothers, the Scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand by the mouth of David concerning Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus. For he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry." (Now this man bought a field with the reward of his wickedness, and falling headlong he burst open in the middle and all his bowels gushed out. And it became known to all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so that the field was called in their own language Akeldama, that is, Field of Blood.) "For it is written in the Book of Psalms.

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""May his camp become desolate,
and let there be no one to dwell in it';
and
""Let another take his office.""
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So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these men must become with us a witness to his resurrection." And they put forward two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also called Justus, and Matthias. And they prayed and said, "You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias, and he was numbered with the eleven apostles.

The Epistle is 1 John 5:9-15

If we receive the testimony of men, the testimony of God is greater, for this is the testimony of God that he has borne concerning his Son.

Whoever believes in the Son of God has the testimony in himself. Whoever does not believe God has made him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God has borne concerning his Son. And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.

I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God that you may know that you have eternal life. And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us. And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him.

The Gospel is John 17:11b-19

[Jesus said,] "Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. While I was with them, I kept them in your name, which you have given me. I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth."

ZION ANNOUNCEMENTS

EDUCATION HOUR: Adult Bible Class continues with Dr. Voelz in Bauer Hall. Please join us. Junior Catechesis meets in the Conference Room with Pastor Punke.

REV. DR. STEVEN SCHUMACHER will preach next Sunday, the Feast of Pentecost, before he and Cindy head back to Ghana, West Africa. We look forward to his proclamation and also will pray for their safe travels and for the success of their work there.

PARENTS WITH LITTLE ONES, there are booster seats available for you in the old narthex (entryway). Ask or pick one up for your toddler to help them sit and see.

MEN OF ZION are studying the prophet Zechariah. Join in on Wednesday mornings at 9:30 AM. We probably have a couple more sessions before summer break.

COVID PROTOCOLS are the same this Sunday, although it was a bit hectic last week at the Holy Communion. See the bulletin insert. We have returned to the altar rail to receive the Holy Communion; kneel if you are able. Some distance may be left between families. Ushers will bring the people in the transepts (both north and south) forward first along with persons sitting upstairs (leave a place for Mike and Sarah in the first table to be served). If you desire an individual cup still for the blood of Christ, pick one up from one of the "source trays" near the center aisle. You will be served with the pouring chalice. Place your used cup in the "used tray" at one of the side aisles. *The persons seated in the nave will be served with a similar procedure after the transepts are finished*.

COVID-19 UPDATE AT ZION: Sigh! Allen County is *still* in yellow with the same two-measure metric of 1.5. We're still hovering between 5% and 6% for average daily positives, and it looks like that will be the case for the next several days. The number of positives per 100,000 in Allen County seems to be coming down ever so slightly. We want that number under 100. Hospitalizations in District 3 for COVID have come down, and ICU bed usage for COVID have too. Still there has been no spike in COVID-related deaths. Thanks be to God. Allen County continues to vaccinate residents, but the number of persons daily being vaccinated is decreasing. We're now 39.7% fully vaccinated. By this Sunday, *it's likely that the eligibility age for vaccinations will be lowered to 12 and older* (under 18 are only eligible for the Pfizer vaccine). While it is true that these vaccines are under an emergency use authorization, when I think of someone like brother Maurice King, who is recovering still after over a year battle with COVID, I maintain that unless there is a medical reason for you not to be vaccinated, odds are much better for you if you get the shot than if you get the virus.

MEMORY VERSE CHALLENGE In this week's memory verses St. Paul reminds us of Jesus' ascension to the Father's right hand and prays for our wisdom and faith, that we may trust in Him we call Lord and Savior: Ephesians 1:16-18a, 20 "I do not crease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers, that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you ... that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places." Last week's verse was John 1:4

What Doctor Luther Says:

About the Holy Word of God Which Sanctifies

A Christian should know that there is nothing more holy on earth than God's Word, for even the sacrament itself is constituted and sanctified and consecrated through God's Word, and all of us have received our spiritual birth from that Word and were consecrated as Christians by it. The Word sanctifies everything, and is above the sacrament (insofar as the sacrament admits of being grasped with the hands). If a Christian nevertheless embraces that Word with his mouth and with his ears and with his heart. yes, with his whole life, why should he not dare also to touch that which is consecrated by the Word? Or should he refrain from touching himself? For he is sanctified by the Word [John 17:17] as well as the sacrament is. This was the way of the Pharisees, concerning whom Christ said in Matt. 23 [:17, 19] that they made the gold more sacred than the temple and the gift more sacred than the altar. It is as if they began to teach that it is a sin to touch the lining of the cup but quite proper to take hold of the cup itself. I wish I could sometime hear something from the papists that they could present without excessive foolishness. But how could those who judge and blaspheme God himself do otherwise?

A Christian is holy in body and soul, whether he be layman or priest, man or woman. If anybody denies that, he speaks blasphemy against holy baptism, the blood of Christ, and the grace of the Holy Spirit. A Christian is a rare and wonderful thing, and God is more concerned about him than about the sacrament. For the Christian was not made for the sacrament, but the sacrament was instituted for the Christian.

Zion Stay-Safe Protocols

- Get vaccinated as soon as you can, if your health permits it. Hoosiers 16 and older can sign up to receive a vaccine.
- If you are sick, GO/STAY HOME; go to the doctor. Worship with us online.
- Continue to practice good hand hygiene by washing your hands and using hand sanitizer.
- Cough or sneeze into a tissue (then throw it away) or into your elbow.
- Those who have NOT been vaccinated are urged to wear a mask while in the pews for your own protection and the protection of others. Those who ARE FULLY vaccinated may wear a mask if you desire to do so; you are no longer being urged to do so.
- Practice social distancing in the pews according to your comfort level.
- * Holy Communion will be served at the altar rail again, kneeling if you are able. Individual cups continue to be offered for the blood of Christ. Pick up an individual cup from the "source tray" on the small table to indicate your desire to drink the blood of Christ in this way. Put your used cup in the "used tray" as you return to your pew by one of the side aisles.
- We are greeting with a shake of the hands. We can still do a fist or arm bump if you desire it.
- Some snacks will return to the Great Hall to encourage socializing after the Divine Service.
