Readings for the First Sunday after the Epiphany The Baptism of our Lord

The Old Testament Reading is Genesis 1:1-5

In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.

And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. And God saw that the light was good. And God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

The Epistle is Romans 6:1-11

What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. For one who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

The Gospel is Mark 1:4-11

John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist and ate locusts and wild honey. And he preached, saying, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And when he came up out of the water, immediately he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

COVID-19 UPDATE AT ZION: Allen County remains in orange. Our daily positives have made a small turn upward, perhaps the post-holiday "surge," but they're not bad. Today's positivity rate is 10.4% — that's good — but the seven-day average is 14.3%. That's a bit better than the state as a whole, but we could surge up into red territory easily. We need to take our metric down from 2.5 to 2. Let's do our part. Our area hospital census has gone down significantly from its high, but ICU bed availability is really low, only 12.9% of ICU beds are available. That remains a concern. No additional word on vaccines. You may want to read my Voice article that includes a section on the moral use of the COVID vaccines. Right now the vaccines available (Pfizer and Moderna) are minimally objectionable, and, I argue, is the lesser of two evils. Let's run the race to the finish with both ourselves and our neighbors in mind.

What Doctor Luther Says:

About Jesus' Preaching Begun at His Baptism "He came to his own people and his own did not receive him" [John 1:11]. These words ... are spoken concerning the coming of [Christ's] preaching, and not concerning his birth. For his "coming" is his preaching and illumining. As the Baptist says in Matthew 3[:11], Luke 3[:16], Mark 1 [:7], and John 1[:27]: "There is one who will come after me whose shoelaces I am not worthy to untie." It is on account of this "coming" that St. John is called his forerunner. As Gabriel says in Luke 1[:17] to Zechariah, John's father: "He will go before him and prepare his way." For, as said above, the gospels begin with Christ; after his baptism he began to be the light and to do the things for which he had come. Therefore he now says: "He came to his own people right in the midst of the world, and they did not accept him." If this were not said of his coming to give light through his preaching and shining, then he would not castigate them so for not having accepted him. Who could know that it was he, had he not been revealed? Therefore they are guilty for not accepting him because he came and was revealed by John and by himself. Therefore John also says in John 1[:3]: "For this reason I have come and am baptizing with water, so that he might be revealed in Israel." And he, himself, in John 5[:43] says: "I have come in my Father's name and you have not accepted me. Another one will come in his own name, and him you will accept." This, too, is clearly said concerning the arrival of the preaching and revelation.
