- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;

(d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. 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Readings for the Second Sunday after the Epiphany

The Old Testament Reading is 1 Samuel 3:1-10

The boy [young man] Samuel was ministering to the LORD in the presence of Eli. And the word of the LORD was rare in those days; there was no frequent vision.

At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his own place. The lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the LORD, where the ark of God was.

Then the LORD called Samuel, and he said, "Here I am!" and ran to Eli and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down.

And the LORD called again, "Samuel!" and Samuel arose and went to Eli and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." Now Samuel did not yet know the LORD, and the word of the LORD had not yet been revealed to him.

And the LORD called Samuel again the third time. And he arose and went to Eli and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived that the LORD was calling the boy. Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down, and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, LORD, for your servant hears." So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

And the LORD came and stood, calling as at other times, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant hears."

The Epistle is 1 Corinthians 6:12-20

"All things are lawful for me," but not all things are helpful. "All things are lawful for me," but I will not be dominated by anything. "Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food"—and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! Or do you not know that he who is joined to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For, as it is written, "The two will become one flesh." But he who is joined to the Lord becomes one spirit with him. Flee from sexual immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the sexually immoral person sins against his own body. Or do

you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body.

The Gospel is John 1:43-51

The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me." Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no deceit!" Nathanael said to him, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." Nathanael answered him, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" Jesus answered him, "Because I said to you, 'I saw you under the fig tree,' do you believe? You will see greater things than these." And he said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man."



COVID-19 UPDATE AT ZION: Allen County is back in red. Rats. I wasn't expecting that since every day I looked our positivity rate was around 10% (today, it's only 8.5%). Today's seven-day average in the county is 15.5%, a bit better than the state as a whole, but nothing to brag about. Our district hospital census continues to go down, praise God, and our ICU bed availability has gone up a bit. It's still a concern. You probably read that vaccines are available now for those 70 and over and for healthcare workers and first responders. It didn't say so, but pastors are eligible as well. I received my first dose on Friday. *I'm hoping that this will open hospitals and nursing homes up to me*. Let's continue to stay safe in church; follow our protocols. The finish line is in sight. Let's run the race to the finish with both ourselves and our neighbors in mind.

What Doctor Luther Says:

About the Unexpected Kingship of Jesus 45. Philip found Nathanael.

Just as Andrew had said to his brother Simon: "We have found the Messiah!" so Phillip here tells Nathanael: "We have found someone who comes from Nazareth, Jesus by name, who is the Messiah, of whom Moses in the Law and the prophets have written." ... It is surprising that they conceived the thought and understood that this Jesus was the Messiah, devoid of all external glory though He was. And here we must recall the concept which the Jews of that day had of the Messiah. Their idea of the Messiah was comparable to our present one of an emperor, king, or other bigwig. The Jews supposed that the Messiah would be the sovereign of the world. In reality, He was to become the Savior of the world.

...[P]robably they had learned from Holy Writ that it had always been God's practice to exalt the poor and the humble and to change shepherds into kings. ... Thus the men in our text thought: "Well, God can change a beggar into a king as easily as He can change a king into a beggar." ... They thought: "After all, who knows? Our God has often disposed it thus and changed a shepherd and poor beggar into a king. Is it not possible that this man, too, is the King, the Messiah, the Lord?"

But their belief was inspired especially by John the Baptist's report of such glorious things about Christ, things which they did not relate to His divinity. ... [T]hese good fellows wished Christ, the Anointed, to be the foremost king in heaven and on earth and to liberate them from Roman bondage. With such thoughts in mind they exclaimed: "We have found the Messiah!" They meant to say: "Until now we have lived under the yoke of the Romans. But God be praised! Now our Horn of salvation has come, who will manifest Himself as a true Judge (Luke 1:69)."
