RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation:
- (d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. The Old Testament Reading is Isaiah 40:21-31

Do you not know? Do you not hear?

Has it not been told you from the beginning?

Have you not understood from the foundations of the earth?

It is he who sits above the circle of the earth,

and its inhabitants are like grasshoppers;

who stretches out the heavens like a curtain,

and spreads them like a tent to dwell in;

who brings princes to nothing,

and makes the rulers of the earth as emptiness.

Scarcely are they planted, scarcely sown,

scarcely has their stem taken root in the earth,

when he blows on them, and they wither,

and the tempest carries them off like stubble.

To whom then will you compare me,

that I should be like him? says the Holy One.

Lift up your eyes on high and see: who created these?

He who brings out their host by number,

calling them all by name,

by the greatness of his might,

and because he is strong in power not one is missing.

Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel,

"My way is hidden from the LORD,

and my right is disregarded by my God"?

Have you not known? Have you not heard?

The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth.

He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable.

He gives power to the faint,

and to him who has no might he increases strength.

Even youths shall faint and be weary,

and young men shall fall exhausted;

but they who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength;

they shall mount up with wings like eagles;

they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.

The Epistle is 1 Corinthians 9:16-27

If I preach the gospel, that gives me no ground for boasting. For necessity is laid upon me. Woe to me if I do not preach the gospel! For

if I do this of my own will, I have a reward, but not of my own will, I am still entrusted with a stewardship. What then is my reward? That in my preaching I may present the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my right in the gospel.

For though I am free from all, I have made myself a servant to all, that I might win more of them. To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though not being myself under the law) that I might win those under the law. To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (not being outside the law of God but under the law of Christ) that I might win those outside the law. To the weak I became weak, that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that by all means I might save some. I do it all for the sake of the gospel, that I may share with them in its blessings.

Do you not know that in a race all the runners compete, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it. Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. So I do not run aimlessly; I do not box as one beating the air. But I discipline my body and keep it under control, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified.

The Gospel is Mark 1:29-39

Immediately [Jesus] left the synagogue and entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. Now Simon's mother-in-law lay ill with a fever, and immediately they told him about her. And he came and took her by the hand and lifted her up, and the fever left her, and she began to serve them.

That evening at sundown they brought to him all who were sick or oppressed by demons. And the whole city was gathered together at the door. And he healed many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons. And he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.

And rising very early in the morning, while it was still dark, he departed and went out to a desolate place, and there he prayed. And Simon and those who were with him searched for him, and they found him and said to him, "Everyone is looking for you." And he said to them, "Let us go on to the next towns, that I may preach there also, for that is why I came out." ZION ANNOUNCEMENTS

EDUCATION HOUR: No Adult Bible Class again today due to the Congregational Assembly. Next week, Adult Bible Class will return. Come and join in.

CONGREGATIONAL ASSEMBLY is today in Bauer Hall after the Divine Service after being canceled last Sunday due to weather. There will be reports, but also important business to take care of: voting whether we should delay the Synod Convention a year, preparing for our District Convention this year (in case the Synod Convention is not delayed), selecting our Lay Delegate, making nominations for officers and committees, etc.

LENT starts with Ash Wednesday, February 17. We will be holding midweek services during Lent, starting with a Divine Service on Ash Wednesday, 7 PM. Many Zion members will have been fully vaccinated by that date. Therefore, we will return to Lenten Suppers at 5:45 PM, prior to the service. The Admin Council will serve the first supper, and servers will continue safety protocols. It's a start to a return to normalcy.

THE ELDERS DECIDED that we would inch slowly toward normalcy as more have received their vaccinations. So, besides the restoration of Lenten suppers on Wednesdays, we'll begin encouraging handshakes after the Divine Service starting in Lent. Please remember, first, that transmission of COVID is not primarily by touch, but by breathing in respiratory droplets. But, second, remember that other viruses like colds and flu are often transmitted by touch. Therefore, we are still promoting good hand hygiene. Of course, if you're uncomfortable beginning this soon, a fist or forearm bump works, too.

DON'T FORGET about the flower chart. Fill it up.

PARENTS WITH LITTLE ONES, there are booster seats available for you in the old narthex (entryway). Ask or pick one up for your toddler to help them sit and see.

COVID-19 UPDATE AT ZION: Allen County remains in orange, but with a lower metric of 2. Our advisory level remains orange. Our positivity rate is hovering around 8.5%. The number of positive cases per 100,000 persons is also coming down, but is still over 200 cases per 100,000 — still too high. For now, *continue protecting yourself and others, first by getting your vaccinations, and second by continuing to follow the appropriate safety protocols.* District 3 COVID-19 hospital census fluctuates but remains well below (70% below) the December 1st peak. Our ICU bed availability is 25%. Hoosiers 65 & older may now get vaccinated. No one I know has had any significant adverse effects from the vaccination, not even the second dose. I've had my second dose and should be fully immunized by next Thursday, February 11. The Elders and I talked about starting to scale back our COVID protocols. We agreed to do it slowly and incrementally (see above). For now, let's continue to run the race to the finish.

MEMORY VERSE CHALLENGE How did you do on last week's challenge verse? This week's verse affirms Jesus' mediatorial role in our salvation — 1 Timothy 2:5-6: "For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all, which is the testimony given at the proper time." Last week's verse was Colossians 2:13-14.

What Doctor Luther Says:

About Confidence in Knowing Your Salvation

Nor does it seem proved that souls in purgatory, at least not all of them, are certain and assured of their own salvation, even if we ourselves may be entirely certain of it.

(This is from Luther's explanation to Thesis 19 of his 95 Theses) ...

2. Records of many examples claim that some souls have confessed this uncertainty of their position, for they have appeared, so to speak, going to the judgment to which they have been called, as St. Vincent and others testify. On the other hand, many examples are recorded in which they have confessed their certainty. To this I respond: First, I have said that not all are certain. Secondly, perhaps it is better, according to the aforesaid, to say that they have not actually been certain, but that, because of their great desire for help, they are, so to speak, certain; and as though they were certain, they have asked to be helped quickly. So they rather imagine they are certain and timidly presume that they are certain as if they know for sure. It is as the gospel says, that the demons knew Jesus was the Christ, that is, they strongly imagined it, as the gloss says. It is natural in every distress and anxiety to imagine very strongly that we may still be restored, although it may be more of a desire for restoration than the hope or knowledge of it, just as in the case of the demons there was more the desire to know than to have knowledge itself. For the actual knowledge of salvation does not make us anxious or cause us to tremble but makes us confident and enables us to bear all things with the greatest courage.

ZION'S ENDOWMENT FUND TO DISTRIBUTE OVER \$36,000 IN 2021 January 2021

The Endowment Fund Committee is pleased to report that the annual distribution from Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church Endowment Fund will total \$36,335.57. With this announced distribution, the total disbursed by the Fund as it completes its 33rd year is now over \$790,000.

Following is a summary of the history of the Endowment Fund.

- It was formed in late 1987 with gifts of \$80,000. The first annual distribution was \$9,215.
- As of December 31, 2020, the Fund had a value of \$1,036,729.84 before deducting the 2021 distribution payment of \$36,335.57.
- Two "Special Purpose Funds" exist within the Endowment Fund:
 - 1. \$146,158.14 for future brick sealing and repair on the historic structure of the church building
 - 2. \$96,660.78 to support the Zion music program
- The growth of the funds are due in part to additional gifts given to the Fund
- Growth has also come from invested returns that have averaged 7.3% annually for the life of the Fund.
- The Fund has a policy of distributing 5% of the general fund's average balance as of the end of the past three calendar years.

The Endowment Fund is a permanent gift from friends and members of Zion, many of them now deceased. Their intention was to leave a legacy gift that would provide perpetual annual support for their beloved Zion for as long as God grants her existence.

Due to requests by members who want to endow a special program benefiting Zion, the committee established the "Special Purpose Funds" identified above.

We encourage you to consider a gift either to be made now or as part of your estate plan. The gift may be made to the Endowment Fund or one of the Special Purpose Funds.
