

RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those: (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;

- (b) who have been **instructed** in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been **confirmed** in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Svnod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.

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Readings for the Second Sunday in Lent

The Old Testament Reading is Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16

When Abram was ninety-nine years old the LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless, that I may make my covenant between me and you, and may multiply you greatly." Then Abram fell on his face. And God said to him, "Behold, my covenant is with you, and you shall be the father of a multitude of nations. No longer shall your name be called Abram, but your name shall be Abraham, for I have made you the father of a multitude of nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful, and I will make you into nations, and kings shall come from you. And I will establish my covenant between me and you and your offspring after you throughout their generations for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you. ...

And God said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her name Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. I will bless her, and moreover, I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall become nations; kings of peoples shall come from her."

The Epistle is Romans 5:1-11

Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. More than that, we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.

For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die—but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

The Gospel is Mark 8:27-38

And Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi. And on the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" And they told him, 'John the Baptist; and others say, Elijah; and others, one of the prophets." And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the Christ." And he strictly charged them to tell no one about him.

And he began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes and be killed, and after three days rise again. And he said this plainly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of man."

And he called to him the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? For what can a man give in return for his life? For whoever is ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of Man also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

SYNOD CONVENTION DELAYED TO 2023 The referendum on delaying the Synod Convention passed overwhelmingly. That means that the District Convention is also delayed until 2022. Thanks to all who agreed to serve. We may ask again later.

MEN OF ZION are studying the prophet Zechariah. Join in on Wednesday mornings at 9:30 AM.

LENTEN VESPERS: This Wednesday (7 PM) we are blessed to hear Sem. Peter Wagner proclaim Jesus' needful death: He died to ransom many. Lenten supper precedes the Vespers at 5:45 PM.

COVID PROTOCOLS now invite you to shake hands after the Divine Service — no pressure, no judgment. The Elders and I made this decision with the understanding that transmission of COVID is not primarily by touch, but by breathing in respiratory droplets. On the other hand, other viruses like colds and flu are often transmitted by touch. We are still promoting good hand hygiene. A fist or forearm bump works if you're not ready to shake hands.

COVID-19 UPDATE AT ZION: Allen County cases continue to decline, and our metrics continue to improve, even though we did not lower our county rating. Our positivity rate is down to 6.1% — Indiana as a whole is doing even better. Allen County is still in yellow (rating 1.5), and our advisory level is yellow. What we're doing is working. Keep it up. Normal is on the horizon, but don't become complacent. *I encourage you to get your vaccinations if you're able (Hoosiers 60 and older are now eligible) and to continue to follow the appropriate safety protocols.* Allen County has 15 sites to receive the vaccination. No one I know has had any significant adverse effects from the vaccination, not even the second dose. District 3 COVID-19 hospital census due to COVID is down further — less than ¼ of the December 1st peak. Our ICU bed availability is over 25% right now, but that's due to a reduction in non-COVID ICU patients.

MEMORY VERSE CHALLENGE How did you do on last week's challenge verses? This week's memory is two verses — 1 Peter 5:8-9: "Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. Resist him, firm in your faith." Last week's verse was Philippians 2:5-11.

What Doctor Luther Says:

About True Praise: a Work and Fruit of Faith

Praise is really a work and fruit of faith, concerning which St. Paul teaches in Romans 10[:10, 9]: "For man believes with his heart and so is justified, but he confesses with his lips and so is saved. For if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." St. Paul here seems to want to say: To believe in Christ secretly in your heart and to praise him in a private corner, is not true faith. You must confess openly with your lips before everyone what you believe in your heart. A confession may cost you your head, for the devil and men do not like to hear it and the cross is a necessary part of this confessing, for you see that the pope, the bishops, priests, and monks neither hear Christ's word nor tolerate it, so that the prophet truly says: "I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of God" [Psalm 116:13], as if he wanted to say: If I praise and confess God, they will give me to drink of the cup of martyrdom. Come then, I will accept it in God's name and will not cease in my praise of God; that cup will not harm me but will be my healing and greatly help me to receive salvation. That is what Christ means when he says, Mark 8[:38]: "Whoever is ashamed of me and of my words in this sinful and adulterous generation, of him will the Son of man also be ashamed, when he comes in the glory of his Father with his holy angels."
