RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those: (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father. Son and Holy Spirit:

- (b) who have been **instructed** in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been **confirmed** in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Svnod:
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;

(d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. The liturgy for the first day of Holy Week is in two parts. It begins with a procession with palms as a dramatic prelude to the Eucharist; this memorable ceremony gives the nickname "Palm Sunday" to the day. The service itself is a celebration of the Passion of Jesus Christ, a highlight of which is the reading (or singing) of a passion account from one of the Gospels. As a prelude to the reading of the passion, the procession with palms provides of an appropriate outburst of joy which does not lose sight of the solemn goal of Jesus' triumphal entry. He rides on to die. The somberness of the passion, which is the focus of Holy Week, is thus framed by the joy of the preparatory procession and by the greater joy of Easter which is its purpose and culmination.

Let us pray: Bless us this day, we beseech You, O Lord, and grant that what Your people today bodily perform with these + branches of palm for Your honor may be perfected spiritually through their devotion to the victory over the enemy won by Your Son Jesus Christ, that they may heartily rejoice in it and ardently love every work of mercy; through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

A Reading from the Evangelist, St. John, the Twelfth Chapter.

The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written, "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about him and had been done to him. The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign. So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after him."

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God!

Collect for Palmarum: Let us pray. Most merciful God, as the people of Jerusalem, with palms in their hands, gathered to greet Your dearly beloved Son when He came into His Holy City, grant that we may ever hail Him as our King and, when He comes again, may go forth to meet Him with trusting and steadfast hearts and follow Him in the way that leads to eternal life; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Let us go forth in peace In the Name of Christ. Amen.

The Congregation with palm branches in hand rises, turns towards the entrance of the nave, and faces the Cross of Christ, the reminder of Christ's promise to come and dwell among His people as they are gathered in His name.

Readings for Palm Sunday

The Old Testament Reading is Zechariah 9:9-12

Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud. O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is he, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the war horse from Jerusalem: and the battle bow shall be cut off, and he shall speak peace to the nations; his rule shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth As for you also, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will set your prisoners free from the waterless pit. Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope; today I declare that I will restore to you double.

The Epistle is Philippians 2:5-11

Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

The Passion of Our Lord according to St. Mark Chapters 14-15 English Standard Version

1. The Plot to Kill Jesus (14:1-2)

- EVANGELIST: It was now two days before the Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread. And the chief priests and the scribes were seeking how to arrest him by stealth and kill him, for they said,
- Chief Priests and Scribes: "Not during the feast, lest there be an uproar from the people."

2. Jesus Anointed at Bethany (14:3–9)

EvangeLIST: And while he was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, as he was reclining at table, a woman came with an alabaster flask of ointment of pure nard, very costly, and she broke the flask and poured it over his head. There were some who said to themselves indignantly,

Disciples: "Why was the ointment wasted like that? For this ointment could have been sold for more than three hundred denarii and given to the poor."

EVANGELIST: And they scolded her. But Jesus said,

Jesus: "Leave her alone. Why do you trouble her? She has done a beautiful thing to me. For you always have the poor with you, and whenever you want, you can do good for them. But you will not always have me. She has done what she could; she has anointed my body beforehand for burial. And truly, I say to you, wherever the gospel is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will be told in memory of her."

3. Judas to Betray Jesus (14:10–11)

EVANGELIST: Then Judas Iscariot, who was one of the twelve, went to the chief priests in order to betray him to them. And when they heard it, they were glad and promised to give him money. And he sought an opportunity to betray him.

4. The Passover with the Disciples (14:12–21)

EVANGELIST: And on the first day of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, his disciples said to him,

Disciples: "Where will you have us go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?"

EVANGELIST: And he sent two of his disciples and said to them,

- *Jesus*: "Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him, and wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, Where is my guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' And he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready; there prepare for us."
- EVANGELIST: And the disciples set out and went to the city and found it just as he had told them, and they prepared the Passover.
- EVANGELIST: And when it was evening, he came with the twelve. And as they were reclining at table and eating, Jesus said,

Jesus: "Truly, I say to you, one of you will betray me, one who is eating with me."

EVANGELIST: They began to be sorrowful and to say to him one after another,

Disciples: "Is it I?"

EVANGELIST: He said to them,

Jesus: "It is one of the twelve, one who is dipping bread into the dish with me. For the Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born."

5. Jesus Institutes the Lord's Supper (14:22–25)

EVANGELIST: And as they were eating, he took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to them, and said,

Jesus: "Take; this is my body."

- EVANGELIST: And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, and they all drank of it. And he said to them,
- *Jesus*: "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. Truly, I say to you, I will not drink again of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God."

6. Jesus Foretells Peter's Denial (14:26-31)

- EVANGELIST: And when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. And Jesus said to them,
- *Jesus*: "You will all fall away, for it is written, 'I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep will be scattered.' But after I am raised up, I will go before you to Galilee."

EVANGELIST: Peter said to him,

Peter: "Even though they all fall away, I will not."

EVANGELIST: And Jesus said to him,

Jesus: "Truly, I tell you, this very night, before the rooster crows twice, you will deny me three times."

EVANGELIST: But he said emphatically,

Peter: "If I must die with you, I will not deny you."

EVANGELIST: And they all said the same.

7. Jesus Prays in Gethsemane (14:32–42)

- EVANGELIST: And they went to a place called Gethsemane. And he said to his disciples,
- Jesus: "Sit here while I pray."
- EVANGELIST: And he took with him Peter and James and John, and began to be greatly distressed and troubled. And he said to them,
- Jesus: "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death. Remain here and watch."
- EVANGELIST: And going a little farther, he fell on the ground and prayed that, if it were possible, the hour might pass from him. And he said,
- *Jesus*: "Abba, Father, all things are possible for you. Remove this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will."
- EVANGELIST: And he came and found them sleeping, and he said to Peter,
- *Jesus*: "Simon, are you asleep? Could you not watch one hour? Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."
- EvangeLIST: And again he went away and prayed, saying the same words. And again he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were very heavy, and they did not know what to answer him. And he came the third time and said to them,
- *Jesus*: "Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? It is enough; the hour has come. The Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. Rise, let us be going; see, my betrayer is at hand."

8. Jesus Is Betrayed and Arrested (14:43–49)

- EVANGELIST: And immediately, while he was still speaking, Judas came, one of the twelve, and with him a crowd with swords and clubs, from the chief priests and the scribes and the elders. Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying,
- Judas: "The one I will kiss is the man. Seize him and lead him away under guard."

EVANGELIST: And when he came, he went up to him at once and said,

Judas: "Rabbi!"

- EVANGELIST: And he kissed him. And they laid hands on him and seized him. But one of those who stood by drew his sword and struck the servant of the high priest and cut off his ear. And Jesus said to them,
- *Jesus*: "Have you come out as against a robber, with swords and clubs to capture me? Day after day I was with you in the temple teaching, and you did not seize me. But let the Scriptures be fulfilled."

9. The Disciples Flee (14:50–52)

EVANGELIST: And they all left him and fled. And a young man followed him, with nothing but a linen cloth about his body. And they seized him, but he left the linen cloth and ran away naked.

10. Jesus Before the Council (14:53-65)

EvangeLIST: And they led Jesus to the high priest. And all the chief priests and the elders and the scribes came together. And Peter had followed him at a distance, right into the courtyard of the high priest. And he was sitting with the guards and warming himself at the fire. Now the chief priests and the whole Council were seeking testimony against Jesus to put him to death, but they found none. For many bore false witness against him, but their testimony did not agree. And some stood up and bore false witness against him, saying,

False Witnesses: "We heard him say, 'I will destroy this temple that is made with hands, and in three days I will build another, not made with hands."

- EVANGELIST: Yet even about this their testimony did not agree. And the high priest stood up in the midst and asked Jesus,
- High Priest: "Have you no answer to make? What is it that these men testify against you?"
- EVANGELIST: But he remained silent and made no answer. Again the high priest asked him,

High Priest: "Are you the Christ, the Son of the Blessed?"

EVANGELIST: And Jesus said,

- *Jesus*: "I am, and you will see the Son of Man seated at the right hand of Power, and coming with the clouds of heaven."
- EVANGELIST: And the high priest tore his garments and said,
- High Priest: "What further witnesses do we need? You have heard his blasphemy. What is your decision?"
- EVANGELIST: And they all condemned him as deserving death. And some began to spit on him and to cover his face and to strike him, saying to him,

Elders: "Prophesy!"

EVANGELIST: And the guards received him with blows.

11. Peter Denies Jesus (14:66-72)

EVANGELIST: And as Peter was below in the courtyard, one of the servant girls of the high priest came, and seeing Peter warming himself, she looked at him and said,

Servant Girl: "You also were with the Nazarene, Jesus."

EVANGELIST: But he denied it, saying,

Peter: "I neither know nor understand what you mean."

EVANGELIST: And he went out into the gateway and the rooster crowed. And the servant girl saw him and began again to say to the bystanders,

Servant Girl: "This man is one of them."

EVANGELIST: But again he denied it. And after a little while the bystanders again said to Peter,

Bystander: "Certainly you are one of them, for you are a Galilean."

EVANGELIST: But he began to invoke a curse on himself and to swear,

Peter: "I do not know this man of whom you speak."

- EVANGELIST: And immediately the rooster crowed a second time. And Peter remembered how Jesus had said to him,
- Jesus: "Before the rooster crows twice, you will deny me three times."

EVANGELIST: And he broke down and wept.

12. Jesus Delivered to Pilate (15:1-5)

EVANGELIST: And as soon as it was morning, the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole Council. And they bound Jesus and led him away and delivered him over to Pilate. And Pilate asked him,

Pilate: "Are you the King of the Jews?"

EVANGELIST: And he answered him,

Jesus: "You have said so."

EVANGELIST: And the chief priests accused him of many things. And Pilate again asked him,

Pilate "Have you no answer to make? See how many charges they bring against you."

EVANGELIST: But Jesus made no further answer, so that Pilate was amazed.

13. Pilate Delivers Jesus to Be Crucified (15:6–15)

EVANGELIST: Now at the feast he used to release for them one prisoner for whom they asked. And among the rebels in prison, who had committed murder in the insurrection, there was a man called Barabbas. And the crowd came up and began to ask Pilate to do as he usually did for them. And he answered them, saying,

Pilate: "Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?"

EVANGELIST: For he perceived that it was out of envy that the chief priests had delivered him up. But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release for them Barabbas instead. And Pilate again said to them,

Pilate: "Then what shall I do with the man you call the King of the Jews?"

EVANGELIST: And they cried out again,

Crowd: "Crucify him."

EVANGELIST: And Pilate said to them,

Pilate: "Why, what evil has he done?"

EVANGELIST: But they shouted all the more,

Crowd: "Crucify him."

EVANGELIST: So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, he delivered him to be crucified.

14. Jesus Is Mocked (15:16-20)

EVANGELIST: And the soldiers led him away inside the palace (that is, the governor's headquarters), and they called together the whole battalion. And they clothed him in a purple cloak, and twisting together a crown of thorns, they put it on him. And they began to salute him,

Soldiers: "Hail, King of the Jews!"

EVANGELIST: And they were striking his head with a reed and spitting on him and kneeling down in homage to him. And when they had mocked him, they stripped

him of the purple cloak and put his own clothes on him. And they led him out to crucify him.

15. Jesus is Crucified (15:21-32)

- EVANGELIST: And they compelled a passerby, Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to carry his cross. And they brought him to the place called Golgotha (which means Place of a Skull). And they offered him wine mixed with myrrh, but he did not take it. And they crucified him and divided his garments among them, casting lots for them, to decide what each should take. And it was the third hour when they crucified him. And the inscription of the charge against him read, "The King of the Jews." And with him they crucified two robbers, one on his right and one on his left. And those who passed by derided him, wagging their heads and saying,
- Passersby: "Aha! You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, save yourself, and come down from the cross!"
- EVANGELIST: So also the chief priests with the scribes mocked him to one another, saying,

MARTIN LUTHER'S ADMONITION TO THE BAPTISMAL PARTY AND THE CONGREGATION

"In all Christian earnestness I would ask all those who administer baptism, who hold the children, or witness it, to take this wonderful work to heart in all its seriousness. For here, in the words of these prayers, you hear how meekly and earnestly the Christian church concerns herself about the little child and how he confesses before God in plain undoubting words that he is possessed by the devil and is a child of sin and wrath, and prays very diligently for aid and grace through baptism that he becomes a child of God. Remember, therefore, that it is no joke to take sides against the devil and not only to drive him away from the little child, but to burden the child with such a mighty and lifelong enemy. Remember, too, that it is very necessary to aid the poor child with all your heart and strong faith, earnestly to intercede for him that God, in accordance with this prayer, would not only free him from the power of the devil, but also strengthen him, so that he may nobly resist the devil in life and death.

I suspect that people turn out so badly after baptism because our concern for them has been so cold and careless; we, at their baptism, interceded for them without zeal. . . . See to it, therefore, that you are present in true faith, listen to God's Word, and earnestly join in prayer. For when the pastor says, "Let us pray," he is exhorting you to unite with him in prayer. And all sponsors and the others present should repeat with him the words of his prayer in their hearts to God, . . . carrying the little child's need before God most earnestly, setting themselves against the devil with all their strength on behalf of the child, and showing that they realize this is no joke as far as the devil is concerned. For this reason it is right and proper . . . to treat the matter with seriousness and true faith, lest the holy sacrament be made a mockery for the devil and an insult to God, who through it showers us with the abundant and infinite riches of his grace. He himself calls it a new birth by which we are being freed from all the devil's tyranny, loosed from sin, death, and hell, and become children of life, heirs of all the gifts of God, God's own children, and brethren of Christ.

Ah, dear Christians, let us not value and administer this unspeakable gift so indolently and indifferently; for baptism is our only comfort and admits to every blessing of God and to the communion of all the saints. To this may God help us! Amen!"

[God does bring blessings to those who are baptized, including infants: "It is taught among us that Baptism is necessary and that grace is offered through it. Children, too, should be baptized, for in Baptism they are committed to God and become acceptable to him."]

[To the sponsors, the parents, and the congregation]

Because this candidate cannot answer for herself, we shall all, together with sponsors and parents, speak in testimony of the forgiveness of sin and the birth of the life of faith which God our Father bestows upon this candidate in and through Baptism:

Do you renounce the devil?I do renounce him! and all his works?I do renounce them! and all his ways?I do renounce them! Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty?

Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son?

Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. EASTER VIGIL The relighting of the Pascal candle for the Easter Vigil (Saturday, April 3) will not happen in the Great Hall, but in the nave this year, similar to the beginning of this Palm Sunday service. Gather on Saturday here in the nave.

WE WILL HAVE EASTER BREAKFAST next Sunday. It is being held 7:45 - 8:55 AM. Will you please bring sweet breads to share with others. Other breakfast items will be provided. *There will be an Easter egg hunt for children grade K and younger*.

SPRING CLEANING: Longer days and warmer weather mean it's almost time for Zion's spring clean-up. This year's event will be Saturday, April 24, from 9 a.m. to noon. We'll be sprucing up the grounds and cleaning, with special focus on the school. If you can, bring rakes, mops and buckets, sponges, etc. Refreshments will be served. PARENTS WITH LITTLE ONES, there are booster seats available for you in the old narthex (entryway). Ask or pick one up for your toddler to help them sit and see. **NO MEN OF ZION** in Holy Week.

COVID PROTOCOLS for Zion will not loosen up any more for a while. Allen County's metrics don't warrant it. You're still invited to shake hands after the Divine Service — no pressure, no judgment. A fist or forearm bump work, too. Remember: transmission of COVID is not primarily by touch, but by breathing in respiratory droplets. Thus are still urging masks in the pews for the sake of the unvaccinated, and we still are promoting good hand hygiene. Ushers have begun handing out bulletins again, and they are collecting the offerings in the pews again. Inching toward normal.

COVID-19 UPDATE AT ZION: Allen County remains in yellow with the same twomeasure metric of 1.5. I don't anticipate that to change for at least a week. It's hard lower the 7-day positivity rate to less than 5% if all our daily rates are above it. I know you shouldn't have to if you are vaccinated, but I still urge you to use caution when in public generally. If you're not vaccinated, I urge you to sign up for your vaccine. There have been 125,854 doses of vaccines administered in the county (including a few J & J), and 49,650 Hoosiers are now fully vaccinated. Statewide, more than 60% of Hoosiers 70 and older (the most vulnerable) are fully vaccinated. Less than 50% of Hoosiers 60 and older are fully vaccinated, and less than 15% in all other age groups have been fully vaccinated, largely due to later eligibility (a much larger percentage in the 50-69 range has received 1 dose). *Hoosiers 40 and older, and also educators, are now eligible. Eligibility will be extended to all persons 16 and older on March 31.*

MEMORY VERSE CHALLENGE How did you do on last week's verse? This week's memory verse focuses on what Luther called the great exchange: 2 Corinthians 5:21 "For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." Last week's verse was 1 Peter 3:18.

What Doctor Luther Says:

About Our King Who Is Just and Comes to Save 9. *Rejoice greatly, O daughters of Zion!* This is, as I have said, the second part of this chapter, in which he describes the very rich comfort and broad propagation of the kingdom of Christ throughout the world among all nations. This passage is quite familiar. The evangelists have cited it (Matt. 21:5; John 12:15), and we have treated it in detail in the Postil.

He comes to you a just Savior. This is quite a wonderful description of this King. Just as He is very different from all the kings of the world, so also His area of responsibility and His royal apparatus are clearly different from those which fit a king of this world. Here there is no violence, no armor, no power, no anger, no wrath. All these, you see, are proper for kings of this world. Here there are only kindness, justice, salvation, mercy, and every good thing. In short, He dispenses the sweetness and the mercy of God. He is just, because He justifies. He is Savior, because He saves. These are qualities which no king could ever bring to his throne. They are qualities far greater than those which befit a man. Moreover, all of these properties are spiritual and depict a spiritual kingdom, which the coming and accession of this just King reveal. For He comes in humility, riding on an ass. Then, too, He is not surrounded by the powers of His subjects. The powers of the people lie in their King rather than the reverse, which is true in the case of worldly kings. Here the entire passage agrees with the antithesis. For if that King of ours is just and does come to save, then we are clearly wicked and condemned sinners. Otherwise He would come with a vain intent to make us righteous and to save us.

Zion Stay-Safe Protocols

- Allen County metrics turned upward reminding us that COVID-19 is still active. Vaccines are available for Hoosiers 40 and older and soon for all Hoosiers 16 and older. We encourage you – be vaccinated!
- Some protocols remain the some; some are changed.
 - If you are sick, GO/STAY HOME; go to the doctor;
 - Continue to practice good hand hygiene by washing your hands and using hand sanitizer;
 - Cough or sneeze into a tissue (then throw it away) or into your elbow.
- We continue to encourage you to wear masks, especially for the sake of neighbor, especially in the pews, because of
