As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those:

- (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;
- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;

(d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.







Readings for the Twenty-fifth Sunday after Pentecost

The Old Testament Reading is Daniel 12:1-3

"At that time shall arise Michael, the great prince who has charge of your people. And there shall be a time of trouble, such as never has been since there was a nation till that time. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone whose name shall be found written in the book. And many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. And those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky above; and those who turn many to righteousness, like the stars forever and ever."

The Epistle is Hebrews 10:11-25

Every priest stands daily at his service, offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God, waiting from that time until his enemies should be made a footstool for his feet. For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are being sanctified.

And the Holy Spirit also bears witness to us; for after saying,

"This is the covenant that I will make with them

after those days, declares the Lord:

I will put my laws on their hearts,

and write them on their minds,"

then he adds,

"I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more."

Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin.

Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

The Gospel is Mark 13:1-13

As [Jesus] came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, "Look, Teacher, what wonderful stones and what wonderful buildings!" And Jesus said to him, "Do you see these great buildings? There will not be left here one stone upon another that will not be thrown down."

And as he sat on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter and James and John and Andrew asked him privately, "Tell us, when will these things be, and what will be the sign when all these things are about to be accomplished?" And Jesus began to say to them, "See that no one leads you astray. Many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he!' and they will lead many astray. And when you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed. This must take place, but the end is not yet. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. These are but the beginning of the birth pains.

"But be on your guard. For they will deliver you over to councils, and you will be beaten in synagogues, and you will stand before governors and kings for my sake, to bear witness before them. And the gospel must first be proclaimed to all nations. And when they bring you to trial and deliver you over, do not be anxious beforehand what you are to say, but say whatever is given you in that hour, for it is not you who speak, but the Holy Spirit. And brother will deliver brother over to death, and the father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death. And you will be hated by all for my name's sake. But the one who endures to the end will be saved."

COVID-19 UPDATE AT ZION: Please read this update if you want information on COVID. I'm not making oral comments regarding COVID unless some protocol needs changing. Allen County remains in orange on the State's coronavirus website with a two-metric score of 2.0, and both metrics going up. The website reports a county positivity rate of 8.8% and weekly cases per 100,000 residents of 296. It's the wrong direction. District hospitalizations have stalled; ICU bed usage is down. Average number of daily deaths due to COVID is at 2 today. The Delta variant is still mostly the culprit although that's down to 97.5% of the positives. The percentages of breakthrough infections, hospitalizations, and deaths continue to increase slowly. They're now 1.753%, 0.038%, and 0.018%, respectively. Vaccines remain the best way to get this pandemic under control, especially for the most vulnerable: those 65+, those with other health issues. Vaccines are available for children 5+, and boosters are available for all three authorized vaccines if you're eligible. Visit www.coronavirus.in.gov/vaccine/ for your eligibility and to schedule your vaccine or booster.

SPEAKER AND ELEVATOR Innovative concepts has received the *repaired* speaker array back from the manufacturer. They are making arrangements with the audio engineer for the reinstallation. No exact date yet, but "we are working to get this reinstalled before Thanksgiving for you." How about that? What Doctor Luther Says:

About Living as Christians ... And When We Don't 16. Do not mind high things. The apostle is speaking of "high" and "humble" things, using the neuter in place of the masculine, as he does also in 1 Cor. 1:27: "God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong," and again: "The foolishness of God is wiser than men" (1 Cor. 1:25). Thus he is trying to say: "Do not be haughty, that is, do not take pleasure in the great people of this world and disregard the humble, but rather be interested in the humble and find your pleasure in them," as blessed Augustine says in his rule: "Do not glory in the dignity of rich parents but in the company of poor brethren." ...

We can take the terms "high things" (*alta*) and "humble things" (*humilia*) as being neuter, referring to things, but this does some violence to the meaning. In this case the meaning will be that no one should give the appearance of possessing high things, whereby he could be noticed and regarded as a great man, but rather possessing lowly things on account of which he could be ignored and despised. And in this sense both statements are used against ambitious men who wish to appear among the great.

It is unnecessary to add here any references to the dissensions, mutual hatreds among kingdoms, duchies, and cities, seemingly to a greater degree than among the heathen, such as among the Venetians, the Italians, the French, the Germans. The German poets prefer the Germans, the French the French. And these things are the greatest virtues, such as they regard of highest worth, almost unmindful of the fact that we are Christians. Thus the word of Christ is fulfilled: "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom" (Mark 13:8).
