by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation; (d) who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. Readings for the Second Sunday after Pentecost

The Old Testament Reading is Genesis 3:8-15

They heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. But the LORD God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" And he said, "I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked, and I hid myself." He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten of the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?" The man said, "The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit of the tree, and I ate." Then the LORD God said to the woman, "What is this that you have done?" The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

The LORD God said to the serpent,
"Because you have done this,
 cursed are you above all livestock
 and above all beasts of the field;
on your belly you shall go,
 and dust you shall eat
 all the days of your life.
I will put enmity between you and the woman,
 and between your offspring and her offspring;

The Epistle is 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

Since we have the same spirit of faith according to what has been written, "I believed, and so I spoke," we also believe, and so we also speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into his presence. For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal.

For we know that if the tent that is our earthly home is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

The Gospel is Mark 3:20-35

Then [Jesus] went home, and the crowd gathered again, so that they could not even eat. And when his family heard it, they went out to seize him, for they were saying, "He is out of his mind."

And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem were saying, "He is possessed by Beelzebul," and "by the prince of demons he casts out the demons." And he called them to him and said to them in parables, "How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but is coming to an end. But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his goods, unless he first binds the strong man. Then indeed he may plunder his house.

"Truly, I say to you, all sins will be forgiven the children of man, and whatever blasphemies they utter, but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin"—for they were saying, "He has an unclean spirit."

And his mother and his brothers came, and standing outside they sent to him and called him. And a crowd was sitting around him, and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers are outside, seeking you." And he answered them, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking about at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! For whoever does the will of God, he is my brother and sister and mother."

PARENTS WITH LITTLE ONES, there are booster seats available for you in the old narthex (entryway). Ask or pick one up for your toddler to help them sit and see.

COVID PROTOCOLS are the same this Sunday, except that service participants will no longer be wearing masks. Members may wear masks if desired. I wrote about this decision in the June Voice, which you should have received. Next Sunday, June 13, we will return to normal also with respect to Holy Communion, returning to our pre-COVID practice of offering common cup only except for those persons who have special health needs. Of course, good hygiene practices (washing hands, coughing or sneezing into a tissue, etc.) are encouraged always.

COVID-19 UPDATE AT ZION: Allen County remains in blue and our advisory level has turned blue also. Our average daily positives reported today is 3.8% and is going down. I doubt the Memorial Day holiday will make any significant difference in that trend. Similarly, the weekly number of positives per 100,000 in Allen County has gone down and is today reported at 47. That's going down, too. Although there remain hotspots around the world, Allen County's numbers and the numbers for the state and nation suggest that the pandemic is over in the U.S.—not that there won't be breakthrough infections, but those should be fewer in number and less severe. The vaccines have worked. They have been very safe. Thus, I do remain concerned about those who are electing not to be vaccinated. Of course, there are valid reasons to avoid being vaccinated; e.g., allergies, already had COVID, you are a woman in your childbearing years, etc. Check with your doctor if you have questions. Otherwise, I submit, it remains prudent to get your vaccination. If you need help scheduling one or getting to the vaccination site, let the office know. We'll help.

What Doctor Luther Says:

About Christ's Spiritual Mother and Father

The evangelist has established here a distinguishing mark: he does not mention Joseph and Mary by name; he calls them father and mother, in order to point out the spiritual meaning. Who, then, are Christ's spiritual father and mother? He himself names his spiritual mother in Mark 3[:34-35] and Luke 8[:21]: "He who does the will of my father, that one is my brother, my sister, and my mother." St. Paul calls himself a father in I Corinthians 4[:15]: "Even if you have ten thousand schoolmasters in Christ, yet you have not many fathers; for I gave birth to you in Christ through the gospel." Thus the Christian church, i.e., all believing persons, is Christ's spiritual mother, and all apostles and teachers of the people, who preach the gospel, are his spiritual father. As often as a man becomes a believer, Christ is born of them. These are the people who marvel over the statements of the prophets, that they apply so nicely and accurately to Christ, speak of him so gloriously, and bear witness to the whole gospel so masterfully. There is no greater joy in this life than to see and experience this in Scripture.


Steven is from Concordia, Mo., and his current home congregation is Zion Lutheran Church, Fort Wayne,
