As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those:

- (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;
- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation:
- (d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.

Readings for the Festival of the Reformation

The First Reading is Revelation 14:6-7

Then I saw another angel flying directly overhead, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people. And he said with a loud voice, "Fear God and give him glory, because the hour of his judgment has come, and worship him who made heaven and earth, the sea and the springs of water."

The Epistle is Romans 3:19-28

Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

The Gospel is John 8:31-36

So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." They answered him, "We are offspring of Abraham and have never been enslaved to anyone. How is it that you say, 'You will become free'?"

Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. The slave does not remain in the house forever; the son remains forever. So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed."

COVID-19 UPDATE AT ZION: Please read this update if you want information on COVID. I'm not making oral comments regarding COVID unless some protocol needs changing. The state is getting slower and slower about updating their website. There is little to update you on either. We will remain in orange at 2.0 with numbers declining. District hospitalizations and ICU bed usage are steady. Average number of daily deaths due to COVID remains 1. No update on the percentage of Delta variant infections compared to others. I'm sure it remains high. The percentages of breakthrough infections, hospitalizations, and deaths are now 1.568%, 0.033%, and 0.016%, respectively. The breakthroughs continue to affect seniors mostly with the average age of breakthrough deaths now at 78. Vaccines remain the best way to get this pandemic under control. Get your vaccination if your health permits it. The state Vaccine website is now tracking booster shots, and a significant number of those have been administered. Boosters are now available for all three authorized vaccines if you're eligible. Visit www.coronavirus.in.gov/vaccine/ for your eligibility.

SPEAKER AND ELEVATOR The speaker array has been sent to the manufacturer to engineer and install a special board. We're looking at the week of November 15 for installation. About the elevator, KONE has ordered another motherboard. No further update that I know of.

What Doctor Luther Says:

Concerning Christian Freedom

Let us learn to place a high value on this freedom of ours; not the emperor, not an angel from heaven, but Christ, the Son of God, through whom all things were created in heaven and earth, obtained it for us by His death, to set us free, not from some physical and temporary slavery but from the spiritual and eternal slavery of those most cruel and invincible tyrants, the Law, sin, death, the devil, etc., and to reconcile us to God the Father. Now that these enemies have been defeated and now that we have been reconciled to God through the death of His Son, it is certain that we are righteous in the sight of God and that all our actions are pleasing to Him; and if there is any sin left in us, this is not imputed to us but is forgiven for the sake of Christ. Paul is speaking very precisely when he says that we should stand in the freedom for which Christ has set us free. Therefore this freedom is granted to us, not on account of the Law or our righteousness but freely, on account of Christ. Paul testifies to this and demonstrates it at length throughout this epistle; and Christ says in John 8:36: "If the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed." He alone is thrust into the middle between us and the evils that oppress us. He conquers and abolishes them, so that they cannot harm us any longer. In fact, in place of sin and death He grants us righteousness and eternal life, and He changes slavery and the terrors of the Law into the freedom of conscience and the comfort of the Gospel, which says (Matt. 9:2): "Take heart, My son; your sins are forgiven." Therefore he who believes in Christ has this freedom.

El Salvador is standing strong against mounting pressure from world powers to legalize the killing of unborn babies in abortions. On October 20, the El Salvadoran Congress voted to reject a petition from proabortion groups that would have legalized abortions on unborn babies conceived as a result of sexual violence and unborn babies with severe deformities, according to AFP. The vote means the country will maintain its laws that protect each unborn baby's right to life and ban all abortions. "We have legislated in favor of protecting life from its conception," said Congresswoman Rebeca Santos, of the New Ideas party, according to the report. However, proabortion lawmakers slammed their peers for rejecting women's "right" to abortion, AFP noted. El Salvador recognizes each unborn baby's right to life in its constitution, stating "as a human person every human being from the moment of conception" in Article 1 ... Pro-abortion groups, funded by some of the richest men in the world, are putting pressure on countries across Latin America and Africa to legalize the killing of unborn babies in abortions ... Argentina fell to the pressure in late 2020, voting to legalize abortion for any reason up to 14 weeks and later in a wide variety of circumstances. Less than four months later, a young woman died along with her unborn baby in a legal abortion ... Aproximately 42.6 million unborn babies were killed in abortions across the world in 2020, according to Worldometer. (LifeNews.com, 10/21/21)
