RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION



- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation:
- (d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. The Old Testament Reading is Daniel 10:10-14; 12:1-3

Behold, a hand touched me and set me trembling on my hands and knees. And he said to me, "O Daniel, man greatly loved, understand the words that I speak to you, and stand upright, for now I have been sent to you." And when he had spoken this word to me, I stood up trembling. Then he said to me, "Fear not, Daniel, for from the first day that you set your heart to understand and humbled yourself before your God, your words have been heard, and I have come because of your words. The prince of the kingdom of Persia withstood me twenty-one days, but Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me, for I was left there with the kings of Persia, and came to make you understand what is to happen to your people in the latter days. For the vision is for days yet to come." ...

"At that time shall arise Michael, the great prince who has charge of your people. And there shall be a time of trouble, such as never has been since there was a nation till that time. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone whose name shall be found written in the book. And many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. And those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky above; and those who turn many to righteousness, like the stars forever and ever."

But woe to you, O earth and sea, for the devil has come down to you in great wrath, because he knows that his time is short!"

The Gospel is Matthew 18:1-11

At that time the disciples came to Jesus, saying, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" And calling to him a child, he put him in the midst of them and said, "Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.

"Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me, but whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone fastened around his neck and to be drowned in the depth of the sea.

"Woe to the world for temptations to sin! For it is necessary that temptations come, but woe to the one by whom the temptation comes! And if your hand or your foot causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life crippled or lame than with two hands or two feet to be thrown into the eternal fire. And if your eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into the hell of fire.

"See that you do not despise one of these little ones. For I tell you that in heaven their angels always see the face of my Father who is in heaven. For the Son of Man came to save the lost."

ZION ANNOUNCEMENTS

EDUCATION HOUR: Today, Adult Bible Class will consider the controversy over "Free Will," Article II in the Formula of Concord. Next Sunday, Dr. Voelz will pick things back up in the Gospel according to St. Mark.

COVID-19 UPDATE AT ZION: Please read this update if you want the information I've been giving. I'll not be making any oral comments regarding COVID in the future unless some protocol needs changing. Finally! We are seeing a downward trend in Allen County's numbers. There is no change in the Advisory color or score (orange, 2.5), but the positivity rate is headed down (soon under 10%) and the number of positives per 100,000 is in the 300s and decreasing. These numbers are a leading indicator of what will happen in hospitalizations and deaths. Right now, they remain high, but I look for them to go down soon; similarly, the seven-day daily average for COVID deaths is 1, but has been as high as 2. ICU bed usage due to COVID is now at 24.3% with 10.5% bed availability. Thankfully, we have not overwhelmed our hospitals. The Delta variant remains the primary cause of infections at 97.4%. No other strains are significant now. Daily administration of vaccines in the state is slow, but we're still making progress. Almost 59% of Hoosiers 18+ have been vaccinated. The percentages of breakthrough infections, hospitalizations, and deaths remain low but are still climbing: 0.903%, 0.020%, and 0.006%, respectively. Vaccines remain the best way to get this pandemic under control. Get your vaccination if your health permits it. If you need help, let the office know.

40 DAYS FOR LIFE fall campaign has begun. I encourage you again to pray to end abortion outside the Planned Parenthood on Lake Ave, but there are other ways to participate. Thanks to Rachel and Laikyn Muehl for helping to organize Zion's participation. Zion's date is Oct 1st. *Please sign up.* See www.ichooselife.org/40days for more info.

SPEAKER AND ELEVATOR Innovative Concepts is hoping to have the power supply in house this Sunday. They'll install it and check out the system. The diagnostics on the elevator have not been good, neither from Otis or Kone. This may be a major expense on the horizon.

DON'T FORGET, consider the stewardship letter, pray about how you can support the work of ministry at Zion, and fill out and return your pledge card by October 24.

What Doctor Luther Says:

Concerning the Angel's Ascent and Descent

[W]hat is this ascent and descent [of the angels upon the Son of Man without a ladder]? I reply that it is this very mystery that in one and the same Person there is true GOD and man. Accordingly the unity of the Person fulfills this mystery. And we, who believe, fulfill the Word of Christ (John 1:51): "You will see ... the angels ... ascending and descending." For we believe in the one Lord, His only-begotten Son, born of the Virgin Mary, true God and man. This mystery is so great, so grand, so inexpressible, that the angels themselves cannot marvel at it enough, much less comprehend it. But, as is stated in 1 Peter 1:12, these are "things into which angels long to look." For angels cannot rejoice and marvel enough at that inexpressible union and unity of the most diverse natures which they do not reach either by ascending or by descending. ...

This is how Christ explains this ladder. I regard this as the chief and proper explanation of this passage. And this is that great and indescribable dignity of mankind which no one can express, namely, that by this wonderful union God has joined the human nature to Himself. ... [T]his pleasure will be a joy above all joy and will be eternal blessedness when we truly behold there our flesh, which is like us in all respects in the highest as well as the lowest place. For He did all this for us. He descended into hell and ascended into heaven. This sight the angels enjoy forever in heaven, and this is what Christ means when He says (Matt. 18:10): "Their angels always behold the face of My Father who is in heaven." They look constantly at the divinity. And now they descend from heaven after He has been made man. Now they look upon Christ and wonder at the work of the incarnation. They see that He has been made man, humiliated, and placed on His mother's lap. They adore the man who was crucified and rejected, and they acknowledge Him as the Son of God.


