Readings for Matins—Easter Sunrise

The First Reading is Job 19:23-27

"Oh that my words were written!
Oh that they were inscribed in a book!
Oh that with an iron pen and lead
they were engraved in the rock forever!
For I know that my Redeemer lives,
and at the last he will stand upon the earth.
And after my skin has been thus destroyed,
yet in my flesh I shall see God,
whom I shall see for myself,
and my eyes shall behold, and not another.
My heart faints within me!

The Second Reading is 1 Corinthians 15:51-57

Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed. For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality. When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written:

"Death is swallowed up in victory."
"O death, where is your victory?
O death, where is your sting?"

The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

The Third Reading is John 20:1-18

Now on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." So Peter went out with the other disciple, and they were going toward the tomb. Both of them were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. And stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the

linen cloths lying there, and the face cloth, which had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen cloths but folded up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples went back to their homes.

But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb, and as she wept she stooped to look into the tomb. And she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had lain, one at the head and one at the feet. They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." Having said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned and said to him in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, "Do not cling to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"—and that he had said these things to her.

What Doctor Luther Says:

About Courage Flowing from Faith in a Living Christ Recently our faith was put to a still harder test. Satan, who always mingles with the children of God [Job 1:6], has made fine sport of us, mainly of me, in Wittenberg. He has permitted our adversaries to indulge their hatred against us. ... I must confess that the smoke sorely smarts my eyes

and makes me heartsick. Here, the devil thought, "I will depress Luther's courage and break his strong spirit. He will neither understand nor overcome what is done."

Alas, I ask myself if this is not happening in punishment of some of my chief patrons and of me. Of my patrons, because, though they believe that Christ is risen, they still wander about in the Garden [looking] for him along with Magdalene, and he has not yet ascended to the Father for them [John 20:17]. Of me, because, as a concession to good friends, I was so subdued at Worms lest I appear stubborn, and so did not make a more explicit and a bolder confession before the tyrants, although since that time these unbelieving heathen have accused me of replying arrogantly. They judge as heathen (that is what they are), who have never sensed a bit of the spirit of faith. I have often regretted my humility and deference.

But be that as it may, whether we sinned or did right, we must for all of that be undaunted and unafraid. For just as we do not boast of our good deeds, neither do we despond in our sins. Rather do we thank God that our faith transcends both good deeds and sins. For the Father of all mercy has granted us faith, not in a wooden but in a living Christ, who is Lord over sin and over innocence, who can support and preserve us even if we fell into many thousands of sins every hour. Of this I have not the slightest doubt."







One of the pastors that helps with devotions, chapels, counseling, teaching, etc. is **Pastor Douglas Punke**. He is the pastor at Zion Lutheran Church. This is one of the churches that helps fund Lutheran South Unity School.

Pastor Punke graduated from Gridley Community Grade School (1970) and High School (1974) in Gridley, Illinois (Central Illinois). He graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1983 from Arkansas College (now Lyon College) in Batesville,

Arkansas, and went to graduate school in Applied Mathematics at Oklahoma State University in Stillwater, Oklahoma, graduating with a Master in Science degree in 1985. He later studied Information and Computer Science at Georgia Institute of Technology in Atlanta, Georgia, graduating with a Master of Science degree in 1990. Pastor Punke attended Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana, and graduated with a Master of Divinity degree in 1998.

He grew up on a farm in rural Central Illinois. After high school, he volunteered for military service in the United States Air Force, serving 5 years on bases in Texas and Oklahoma. After being discharged in 1979, he went to college. Pastor Punke played basketball on his college team for two years. After graduating from graduate school in mathematics, he returned to his alma mater, Arkansas College, to teach, which he did from 1985 to 1994. In 1999, Pastor Punke received a call to serve Trinity Lutheran Church in Clinton, Missouri. He served there four years before being called in 2003 to serve Zion Lutheran Church in Fort Wayne. He has been at Zion for 19 years now. His work in the church has also taken him overseas to Siberia and South Sudan.

Pastor Punke is also the chairman of the non-profit corporation Saint Peter/Zion Project, Inc., which works on urban renewal around Zion Lutheran and Saint Peter Catholic Churches.

Besides being pastor at Zion and of the Lutheran South Association, he serves the church as District Secretary, serving on the District Board of Directors and various committees and task forces. He has served as Circuit Visitor. He has a keen interest in Lutheran education and currently serves on the Concordia High School Board of Directors. He has served in the past on the Board of The Lutheran Schools Partnership.

Pastor Punke is married to Marge for the last 46 years. They have no children of their own, but account as their own several whose lives have involved theirs. He enjoys working in the yard in the summer, listening to podcasts and staying up with the news, singing in the Bach Collegium, and watching classic movies and musicals.
