- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation:
- (d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. Readings for the Second Sunday in Lent

The Old Testament Reading is Jeremiah 26:8-15

When Jeremiah had finished speaking all that the LORD had commanded him to speak to all the people, then the priests and the prophets and all the people laid hold of him, saying, "You shall die! Why have you prophesied in the name of the LORD, saying, 'This house shall be like Shiloh, and this city shall be desolate, without inhabitant'?" And all the people gathered around Jeremiah in the house of the LORD.

When the officials of Judah heard these things, they came up from the king's house to the house of the LORD and took their seat in the entry of the New Gate of the house of the LORD. Then the priests and the prophets said to the officials and to all the people, "This man deserves the sentence of death, because he has prophesied against this city, as you have heard with your own ears."

Then Jeremiah spoke to all the officials and all the people, saying, "The LORD sent me to prophesy against this house and this city all the words you have heard. Now therefore mend your ways and your deeds, and obey the voice of the LORD your God, and the LORD will relent of the disaster that he has pronounced against you. But as for me, behold, I am in your hands. Do with me as seems good and right to you. Only know for certain that if you put me to death, you will bring innocent blood upon yourselves and upon this city and its inhabitants, for in truth the LORD sent me to you to speak all these words in your ears."

The Epistle is Philippians 3:17–4:1

Brothers, join in imitating me, and keep your eyes on those who walk according to the example you have in us. For many, of whom I have often told you and now tell you even with tears, walk as enemies of the cross of Christ. Their end is destruction, their god is their belly, and they glory in their shame, with minds set on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself.

Therefore, my brothers, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm thus in the Lord, my beloved.

The Gospel is Luke 13:31-35

At that very hour some Pharisees came and said to [Jesus], "Get away from here, for Herod wants to kill you." And he said to them, "Go

and tell that fox, 'Behold, I cast out demons and perform cures today and tomorrow, and the third day I finish my course. Nevertheless, I must go on my way today and tomorrow and the day following, for it cannot be that a prophet should perish away from Jerusalem.' O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you would not! Behold, your house is forsaken. And I tell you, you will not see me until you say, 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!'"



DONATIONS ARE NEEDED: Hailey Horn is a LSUS 2nd grader and an identical twin. She became very ill in November from an ear infection that spread to her brain. She had emergency brain surgery that left her unable to move her left side and without a skull on her right side. She was put in a coma state to heal. She was moved to Riley Hospital where she spent a month in rehab learning to walk, talk and use her left side again. Hailey returned to school a few weeks ago wearing a helmet and using a cane and slowly getting back to her normal life. The expenses this family has had to endure have been great. LSUS is requesting gifts of love to the family to help pay for these expenses. You can direct your gifts to Zion for thus purpose, and we can forward them to the school on Hailey's behalf.

COVID-19 UPDATE AT ZION: Please read this update if you want information on COVID. This update may be my last. Allen County should change to blue this week with an advisory level still of yellow. The Seven-Day Positivity Rate is down to 3.2% as of Mar. 1; we're surely in the 2% range. The Weekly Cases per 100,000 Residents metric is below 30 and still decreasing. When people get COVID, it's the Omicron variant. District 3 hospitalizations and ICU bed usage due to COVID are very low. Average deaths due to COVID remain at 0. Breakthrough COVID cases are 0.113% and 0.061%, respectively, for hospitalizations and deaths. I don't see a reason to report breakthrough cases. There have surely been more of those than what has been reported. I don't see any reason to encourage vaccinations any more. Here's the info, if you still want to: www.coronavirus.in.gov/vaccine.

What Doctor Luther Says:

About Bitter Enemies of Christ within Christendom

[O]ur [pure] doctrine today is still slandered and condemned as heresy and devilish doctrine (1 Tim. 4:1). Many of our adherents are banished and cast out into a life of misery; some are murdered wretchedly as heretics and rebels simply because we teach and confess that man is justified before God and saved through faith in Christ. This faith we laud and exalt on the basis of the Gospel. We declare, on the other hand, that the pope with his faction and all others, whoever they are and whatever they are called, who do not bear witness to Christ and direct the people to Him, are seducers and assassins of the soul. And today it comes to pass that not the Turks, the avowed enemies of the Christian name, but our brethren, who bear the Christian name and claim to be Christians, feel constrained to persecute, banish, and murder us. And all this they do under the pretext and guise of thereby rendering God a favor (John 16:2). Thus it must be, as it always has been, that those who profess to be the holiest and the best are, in fact, the ones who do the most damage to Christ, His Word, and His church. Christ Himself bears this out in Luke 13:33: "It cannot be that a prophet should perish away from Jerusalem." This means: He must be slain by His own; they must needs hate Christ and persecute Him and His preachers. ...

[W]e are blind to the fact that we are far worse and more ferocious enemies of the Lord Christ than the Turk is. Today we are still crucifying Christ, we spit in His face, tread his Sacraments underfoot, and soil our hands with Christian blood. And yet we presume to pose as protectors of the church. We want to take the field against the Turks and defeat them, although we are bitterer enemies of Christ than they.


