RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those:

- (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;
- (b) who have been **instructed** in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been **confirme** in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who **believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them**, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.

Beloved in the Lord! Let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins unto God, our Father, beseeching Him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.

Our help is in the name of the Lord Who made heaven and earth. I said, I will confess my transgressions unto the Lord. And You forgave the iniquity of my sin.

O almighty God, merciful Father, I, a poor, miserable sinner, confess unto You all my sins and iniquities with which I have ever offended You and justly deserved Your temporal and eternal punishment. But I am heartily sorry for them and sincerely repent of them, and I pray You of Your boundless mercy and for the sake of the holy, innocent, bitter sufferings and death of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, to be gracious and merciful to me, a poor, sinful being.

Upon this your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God unto all of you, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen!

The Congregation rises, turns towards the entrance of the nave, and faces the Cross of Christ, the reminder of Christ's promise to come and dwell among His people as they are gathered in His name.

Confession of Faith (The Athanasian Creed)

- 1 *Whoever desires to be saved must, above all, hold the catholic faith.*
- 2 **Whoever does not keep it whole and undefiled will without doubt perish eternally.**
- 3 *And the catholic faith is this,*
- 4 **that we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance.**
- 5 *For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is another.*
- 6 **But the Godhead of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit is one: the glory equal, the majesty coeternal.**
- 7 *Such as the Father is, such is the Son, and such is the Holy Spirit:*
- 8 **the Father uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated;**
- 9 *the Father infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite*
- 10 **the Father eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal.**
- 11 *And yet there are not three Eternals, but one Eternal,*
- 12 **just as there are not three Uncreated or three Infinites, but one Uncreated and one Infinite**
- 13 *In the same way, the Father is almighty, the Son almighty, the Holy Spirit almighty;*
- 14 **and yet there are not three Almightyies but one Almighty.**
- 15 *So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God;*
- 16 **and yet there are not three Gods, but one God.**
- 17 *So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord;*
- 18 **and yet there are not three Lords, but one Lord.**
- 19 *Just as we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord,*
- 20 **so also are we prohibited by the catholic religion to say that there are three Gods or Lords.**
- 21 *The Father is not made nor created nor begotten by anyone. The Son is neither made nor created, but begotten of the Father alone.*
- 22 **The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son, neither made nor created nor begotten but proceeding.**
- 23 *Thus, there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.*
- 24 **And in this Trinity none is before or after another; none is greater or less than another;**
- 25 *but the whole three persons are coeternal with each other so that in all things, as has been stated above, the Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity is to be worshiped.*
- 26 **Therefore, whoever desires to be saved must think thus about the Trinity.**
- 27 *But it is also necessary for everlasting salvation that one faithfully believe the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.*
- 28 **Therefore, it is the right faith that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is at the same time both God and man.**
- 29 *He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father before all ages; and He is man, born from the substance of His mother in this age:*
- 30 **perfect God and perfect man, composed of a rational soul and human flesh**
- 31 *equal to the Father with respect to His divinity, less than the Father with respect to His humanity.*
- 32 **Although He is God and man, He is not two, but one Christ:**
- 33 *one, however, not by the conversion of the divinity into flesh but by the assumption of the humanity into God;*
- 34 **one altogether, not by confusion of substance, but by unity of person.**
- 35 *For as the rational soul and flesh is one man, so God and man is one Christ*
- 36 **who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose again from the dead,**
- 37 *ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead.*
- 38 **At His coming all people will rise again with their bodies and give an account concerning their own deeds.**
- 39 *And those who have done good will enter into eternal life, and those who have done evil into eternal fire.*
- 40 **This is the catholic faith; whoever does not believe it faithfully and firmly cannot be saved.**





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Readings for the Festival of the Holy Trinity

The Old Testament Reading is Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31

Does not wisdom call?

Does not understanding raise her voice?

On the heights beside the way,

at the crossroads she takes her stand;

beside the gates in front of the town,

at the entrance of the portals she cries aloud:

“To you, O men, I call, and my cry is to the children of man. ...”

“The LORD possessed me at the beginning of his work,

the first of his acts of old.

Ages ago I was set up,

at the first, before the beginning of the earth.

When there were no depths I was brought forth,

when there were no springs abounding with water.

Before the mountains had been shaped,

before the hills, I was brought forth,

before he had made the earth with its fields,

or the first of the dust of the world.

When he established the heavens, I was there;

when he drew a circle on the face of the deep,

when he made firm the skies above,

when he established the fountains of the deep,

when he assigned to the sea its limit,

so that the waters might not transgress his command,

when he marked out the foundations of the earth,

then I was beside him, like a master workman,

and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always,

rejoicing in his inhabited world

and delighting in the children of man.”

The Second Reading is Acts 2:14a, 22-36

Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them,

...

“Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that God did through him in your midst, as you yourselves know— this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it. For David says concerning him,

‘I saw the Lord always before me,

for he is at my right hand that I may not be shaken;
therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced;
my flesh also will dwell in hope.

For you will not abandon my soul to Hades,
or let your Holy One see corruption.

You have made known to me the paths of life;
you will make me full of gladness with your presence.'

"Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. Being therefore a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would set one of his descendants on his throne, he foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh see corruption. This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing. For David did not ascend into the heavens, but he himself says,

'The Lord said to my Lord,

"Sit at my right hand,

until I make your enemies your footstool.'"

"Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified."

The Gospel is John 8:48-59

The Jews answered [Jesus], "Are we not right in saying that you are a Samaritan and have a demon?" Jesus answered, "I do not have a demon, but I honor my Father, and you dishonor me. Yet I do not seek my own glory; there is One who seeks it, and he is the judge. Truly, truly, I say to you, if anyone keeps my word, he will never see death." The Jews said to him, "Now we know that you have a demon! Abraham died, as did the prophets, yet you say, 'If anyone keeps my word, he will never taste death.' Are you greater than our father Abraham, who died? And the prophets died! Who do you make yourself out to be?" Jesus answered, "If I glorify myself, my glory is nothing. It is my Father who glorifies me, of whom you say, 'He is our God.' But you have not known him. I know him. If I were to say that I do not know him, I would be a liar like you, but I do know him and I keep his word. Your father Abraham rejoiced that he would see my day. He saw it and was glad." So the Jews said to him, "You are not yet fifty years old, and have you seen Abraham?" Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I am." So they picked up stones to throw at him, but Jesus hid himself and went out of the temple.

What Doctor Luther Says:

About Abraham's Knowledge of the Trinity

The fathers did not speak so stupidly about the Trinity as to explain that these three men who were seen by Abraham with his physical eyes [Gen. 18] were regarded by him as the three Persons of the Deity. ...

It is correct to say that [at Christ's baptism] God is in Christ the human being, that the Holy Spirit is in the dove, and that the Father is in the voice. But we are not so stupid as to say that the outward phenomena or the physical object that is seen with the eyes and can be comprehended is God, for we know that the Trinity is invisible.

Therefore the fathers stated in different words and not in so stupid a manner why God wanted to reveal Himself to Abraham in three persons and not in four or in two, or why God chose to appear in just three persons.

Thus I have shown from the hidden meaning and not from the historical one that God is one and three, inasmuch as Abraham saw three and worshipped one. The saintly fathers expressed themselves in this manner, ... for God wanted to appear to Abraham in a trinity of angels. Inasmuch, then, as three appear and one speaks, and inasmuch as Abraham sees three and worships one, the fathers state that it is indicated that in God there is a trinity and not that those three forms or persons are the Trinity. ...

Against the venomous tongues let us, then, defend our teachers who say that Abraham saw the Trinity in a hidden sense, inasmuch as God appeared to him not in fewer or in more persons than three; for if he saw the day of Christ, as Christ clearly bears witness in the New Testament (John 8:56), he undoubtedly saw also His divine nature. But if he saw His divine nature, this could not have happened without a knowledge of the Trinity.
