RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.







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Readings for the Feast of the Nativity of Our Lord

The Old Testament Reading is Isaiah 52:7-10

How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news. who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness, who publishes salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns." The voice of your watchmen—they lift up their voice; together they sing for joy; for eye to eye they see the return of the LORD to Zion. Break forth together into singing, you waste places of Jerusalem, for the LORD has comforted his people; he has redeemed Jerusalem. The LORD has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God "

The Epistle is Hebrews 1:1-12

Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

For to which of the angels did God ever say,

"You are my Son, today I have begotten you"? Or again,

"I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son"? And again, when he brings the firstborn into the world, he says,

"Let all God's angels worship him."

Of the angels he says,

"He makes his angels winds, and his ministers a flame of fire." But of the Son he says,

"Your throne, O God, is forever and ever,

the scepter of uprightness is the scepter of your kingdom. You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness;

therefore God, your God, has anointed you

with the oil of gladness beyond your companions."

And,

"You, Lord, laid the foundation of the earth in the beginning, and the heavens are the work of your hands;

they will perish, but you remain;

they will all wear out like a garment,

like a robe you will roll them up,

like a garment they will be changed.

But you are the same, and your years will have no end."

The Gospel is John 1:1-18

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.

The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. (John bore witness about him, and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, because he was before me."") For from his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God; the only God, who is at the Father's side, he has made him known.

What Doctor Luther Says:

About the Concrete Reality of Christ's Incarnation

The heretical Manichaeans, knaves that they were, took offense at the assertion that the Son of God had become man. To embellish their error, they feigned great saintliness and profound wisdom, saying that it was an insult to the divine majesty to claim that He had been born from poor and sin-corrupted, impure and mortal flesh, and from the flesh of a woman at that. They protested that it was impossible that the divine purity, which exceeds the brightness of the sun, should submerge itself into this vile slime. Therefore they averred that Mary was not the true, natural, and physical mother of Christ. ... [T]hey claimed, a shadow or phantom passed through Mary, like a ghost that has no real body or soul. They claimed that Christ had only resembled a man, but, in reality, was no true human. Thus they reduced Him to a ghost; this implies, of course, that the Jews crucified an incorporeal phantom. In this way they tried to make their heresy palatable. ...

But we believe the Scriptures and confess with holy Christendom, which existed at all times and will endure till the end of the world, that this article of our holy Christian creed, together with all others, is firmly and solidly established by the testimony of the holy prophets and apostles, the spokesmen of the Holy Spirit: that Christ, our Lord and God, assumed true human nature, not the nature of an immaterial phantom, and that He became a natural man like any other man of flesh and blood. He did not flutter about like a spirit, but He dwelt among men. He had eyes, ears, mouth, nose, chest, stomach, hands, and feet, just as you and I do. He took the breast. His mother nursed Him as any other child is nursed. He acted as any other human does. He was born as a true man from the Virgin Mary; the one difference, however, was that He was not born in sin as we are, that "He committed no sin, and no guile was found on His lips" (Is. 53:9; 1 Peter 2:22).

Thanks to God for sending us our Savior. "O come, let us adore Him, Christ the Lord!" by André Woodard And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." Luke 2:10-12.

The Christmas story in Luke's Gospel is not all that extraordinary. Art Just says, "The hearer is struck by how simply Luke reports Jesus' birth ..." (Just, *Concordia Commentary: Luke 1:1–9:50*, p. 106). The government required Joseph and his pregnant wife to travel to Bethlehem because Caesar wanted his tax money. The Holy Family obeyed the imperial order, but when they arrived, there was no place for them to stay. There was no guest room available (likely not what we usually think of as an "inn"). The time came for Mary to give birth — she bore a son and laid him in a manger. Interesting, but this news is not all that good.

But then the angel proclaims this son of Mary to be the Savior, Christ the Lord. Now we're getting to the Good News of great joy. Indeed, Luther calls belief in this message "the first faith." He says, "there are many who have this belief and do not doubt this first belief that Christ is the Lord, the Savior, and the virgin's Son." Still it's not quite enough, he says. "[T]his belief is held by the devil too and the Turks and all the godless among the Christians, and is the kind of belief which everybody believes that it is true ..." (*Luther's Works*, 51:212).

He continues, "Beyond the first faith there must be the second faith, that Christ is not only the virgin's Son, but also the Lord of angels and the Savior of men," that is, your Savior (p. 213). "Therefore, this is the chief article, which separates us from all the heathen, that you, O man, may not only learn that Christ, born of the virgin, is the Lord and Savior, but also accept the fact that he is your Lord and Savior, that you may be able to boast in your heart: I hear the Word that sounds from heaven and says: This child who is born of the virgin is not only his mother's son. I have more than the mother's estate; he is more mine than Mary's, for he was born for me, for the angel said, 'To you' is born the Savior. Then ought you to say, Amen, I thank thee, dear Lord" (p. 215).

Yes, the words "for you" are truly the Gospel and "require all hearts to believe," whether we're talking incarnation or the sacrament. God grant us this second faith. Have a blessed Christmas and a happy New Year.
