- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. Readings for the Eighth Sunday after Pentecost

The Old Testament Reading is Amos 7:7-15

This is what [the Lord GOD] showed me: behold, the Lord was standing beside a wall built with a plumb line, with a plumb line in his hand. And the LORD said to me, "Amos, what do you see?" And I said, "A plumb line." Then the Lord said,

"Behold, I am setting a plumb line in the midst of my people Israel; I will never again pass by them; the high places of Isaac shall be made desolate, and the sanctuaries of Israel shall be laid waste, and I will rise against the house of Jeroboam with the sword."

Then Amaziah the priest of Bethel sent to Jeroboam king of Israel, saying, "Amos has conspired against you in the midst of the house of Israel. The land is not able to bear all his words. For thus Amos has said,

'Jeroboam shall die by the sword, and Israel must go into exile away from his land.'"

And Amaziah said to Amos, "O seer, go, flee away to the land of Judah, and eat bread there, and prophesy there, but never again prophesy at Bethel, for it is the king's sanctuary, and it is a temple of the kingdom." Then Amos answered and said to Amaziah, "I was no prophet, nor a prophet's son, but I was a herdsman and a dresser of sycamore figs. But the LORD took me from following the flock, and the LORD said to me, 'Go, prophesy to my people Israel."

The Epistle is Ephesians 1:3-14

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love he predestined us for adoption through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace, with which he has blessed us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, which he lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight making known to us the mystery of his will, according to his purpose, which he set forth in

Christ as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth.

In him we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will, so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of his glory.

The Gospel is Mark 6:14-29

King Herod heard of it, for Jesus' name had become known. Some said, "John the Baptist has been raised from the dead. That is why these miraculous powers are at work in him." But others said, "He is Elijah." And others said, "He is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old." But when Herod heard of it, he said, "John, whom I beheaded, has been raised." For it was Herod who had sent and seized John and bound him in prison for the sake of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, because he had married her. For John had been saying to Herod, "It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife." And Herodias had a grudge against him and wanted to put him to death. But she could not, for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a righteous and holy man, and he kept him safe. When he heard him, he was greatly perplexed, and yet he heard him gladly.

But an opportunity came when Herod on his birthday gave a banquet for his nobles and military commanders and the leading men of Galilee. For when Herodias's daughter came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his guests. And the king said to the girl, "Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it to you." And he vowed to her, "Whatever you ask me, I will give you, up to half of my kingdom." And she went out and said to her mother, "For what should I ask?" And she said, "The head of John the Baptist." And she came in immediately with haste to the king and asked, saying, "I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter." And the king was exceedingly sorry, but because of his oaths and his guests he did not want to break his word to her. And immediately the king sent an executioner with orders to bring John's head. He went and beheaded him in the prison and brought his head on a platter and gave it to the girl, and the girl gave it to her mother. When his disciples heard of it, they came and took his body and laid it in a tomb.



What Doctor Luther Says:

About the Persecution and Slaughter of the Prophets

15. So Jacob called the name of the place where God had spoken with him,

Bethel.

The special fame of this place above others is to be noted. For now it is called Bethel a third time. But would this not produce false prophets and idolatry? Jeroboam, to be sure, abused this fame and shifted all the divine worship of religion to that place (1 Kings 12:29). For this reason Hosea and the prophets of his day had such great conflicts and difficulty in condemning and abolishing idolatry at Bethel. ... For the false prophets made objections to the godly priests and prophets, saying: "Why is it that you glory in the temple at Jerusalem? Read Genesis, and there you will find that God appeared to Jacob in this place and that therefore it was called בֵּיִח־אֵל [El Bethel]." What more certain and more reliable argument could be advanced? It also seems an irrefutable argument. ...

This, then, was the occasion and cause for persecuting and slaughtering the godly teachers and prophets, as Amaziah reproaches Amos bitterly, saying (Amos 7:12-13): "Flee away to the land of Judah and eat bread there and prophesy there; but never again prophesy at Bethel, for it is the king's sanctuary, and it is a temple of the kingdom," that is, it is the house of God which King Jeroboam founded.

But the true answer to these specious objections of the false prophets was this: "God spoke with the prophets at His own time and in His own places, but later He clearly said through Moses (Ex. 20:24): 'In every place where I cause My name to be remembered I will come to you and bless you,' not in any place you please — mountain, meadow, or river, but you should have regard for that place which the Lord has chosen." *Luther's Works*, 6:264-5.

LaToya came to Lutheran Social Services through LSSI Works. Like many of the participants in the program, she was tired of struggling day to day, just to get by. A single mom in recovery from substance use, she had worked so hard but felt like she couldn't get traction to anything more than merely "surviving."

While at LSSI Works, during a session about other supports LSSI offered, she learned about and expressed interest in Recovery Care. Almost immediately, she was enrolled in services to further support her addiction recovery as she began full-time employment and provided for her child's needs.



During her time in both programs, LaToya established important connections within the recovery community that would help her continue to create her new sober lifestyle. She worked with staff to establish a wellness recovery plan that identified the triggers that previously would cause her to relapse and identify the tools she needed to maintain her recovery when life got difficult. Most importantly, LaToya learned of her own value and worth. She finally started to understand the life that she and her child could have with continued work and focus

This summer, LaToya will celebrate one year of employment at General Motors. Her path to economic and family stability is much broader and stronger today than it ever has been!




