- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. Readings for the Seventh Sunday after Pentecost

The Old Testament Reading is Ezekiel 2:1-5

He said to me, "Son of man, stand on your feet, and I will speak with you." And as he spoke to me, the Spirit entered into me and set me on my feet, and I heard him speaking to me. And he said to me, "Son of man, I send you to the people of Israel, to nations of rebels, who have rebelled against me. They and their fathers have transgressed against me to this very day. The descendants also are impudent and stubborn: I send you to them, and you shall say to them, 'Thus says the Lord GOD.' And whether they hear or refuse to hear (for they are a rebellious house) they will know that a prophet has been among them."

The Epistle is 2 Corinthians 12:1-10

I must go on boasting. Though there is nothing to be gained by it, I will go on to visions and revelations of the Lord. I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heavenwhether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows. And I know that this man was caught up into paradise—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows-and he heard things that cannot be told, which man may not utter. On behalf of this man I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. Though if I should wish to boast, I would not be a fool, for I would be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think more of me than he sees in me or hears from me. So to keep me from being too elated by the surpassing greatness of the revelations, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to harass me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me. But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me. For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

The Gospel is Mark 6:1-13

[Jesus] went away from there and came to his hometown, and his disciples followed him. And on the Sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astonished, saying, "Where did this man get these things? What is the wisdom given to him? How

are such mighty works done by his hands? Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? And are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. And Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor, except in his hometown and among his relatives and in his own household." And he could do no mighty work there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and healed them. And he marveled because of their unbelief.

And he went about among the villages teaching. And he called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. He charged them to take nothing for their journey except a staff—no bread, no bag, no money in their belts—but to wear sandals and not put on two tunics. And he said to them, "Whenever you enter a house, stay there until you depart from there. And if any place will not receive you and they will not listen to you, when you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them." So they went out and proclaimed that people should repent. And they cast out many demons and anointed with oil many who were sick and healed them.






What Doctor Luther Says:

About the Devil's Mr. Nobody and God's Forgiveness [When you encounter sin,] you will hear the answer: "Mr. Nobody is responsible." No one will acknowledge his guilt. And yet the damage has been done, and you grieve over it. Sometimes a servant is caught in the act and still denies it. If the guilty one confessed it, the master would pardon him. But devil and death have brought that Mr. Nobody into the world. As a result, man is so base and vile that he pushes the blame on others. If man admitted his sin, he could readily obtain mercy and find a gracious God. For what would God not be glad to give us, if we only came to the cross? However, people refuse to do that. And by this refusal they augment their sin sevenfold; yes, they multiply it without end and measure. This was bemoaned and lamented by all the prophets. Moses called the Children of Israel "a stubborn, stiff-necked, and disobedient nation unwilling to obey and follow God." Ps. 78:8 expresses a similar complaint, as do Jer. 5:3 and Ezek. 2:4. And in Acts 7:51 Stephen rebukes the Jews: "You always resist the Holy Spirit." The devil follows the same pattern. He denies everything and thus makes seven sins out of one. ...

It is bad enough if I refuse to admit a sin which I really feel and for which the Son of God was given to us as the Man who is to forgive sin. But the devil does not let us stop there; he bids us defend ourselves with our Mr. Nobody. To commit a sin and then to deny it and try to justify it, is not human; no, that is devilish ...

When the Light tells you: "You are evil and sinful," you should acknowledge this and reply: "It is true!" Then you will have forgiveness of sin. *Luther's Works*, 22:396-8.

LaToya's Story





LaToya came to Lutheran Social Services through LSSI Works. Like many of the participants in the program, she was tired of struggling day to day, just to get by. A single mom in recovery from substance use, she had worked so hard but felt like she couldn't get traction to anything more than merely "surviving."

While at LSSI Works, during a session about other supports LSSI offered, she learned about and expressed interest in Recovery Care. Almost immediately, she was enrolled in services to further support her addiction recovery as she began full-time employment and provided for her child's needs.

During her time in both programs, LaToya established important connections within the recovery community that would help her continue to create her new sober lifestyle. She worked with staff to establish a wellness recovery plan that identified the triggers that previously would cause her to relapse and identify the tools she needed to maintain her recovery when life got difficult. Most importantly, LaToya learned of her own value and worth. She finally started to understand the life that she and her child could have with continued work and focus

This summer, LaToya will celebrate one year of employment at General Motors. Her path to economic and family stability is much broader and stronger today than it ever has been!



In 2023, more than 5,000 people were impacted by LSSI Services, 83% of these families were at or below the federal poverty line. More than 2500 of these individuals impacted were children.
