
- (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. Readings for the Festival of St. Michael and All Angels

The Old Testament Reading is Daniel 10:10-14; 12:1-3

Behold, a hand touched me and set me trembling on my hands and knees. And he said to me, "O Daniel, man greatly loved, understand the words that I speak to you, and stand upright, for now I have been sent to you." And when he had spoken this word to me, I stood up trembling. Then he said to me, "Fear not, Daniel, for from the first day that you set your heart to understand and humbled yourself before your God, your words have been heard, and I have come because of your words. The prince of the kingdom of Persia withstood me twenty-one days, but Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me, for I was left there with the kings of Persia, and came to make you understand what is to happen to your people in the latter days. For the vision is for days yet to come." ...

"At that time shall arise Michael, the great prince who has charge of your people. And there shall be a time of trouble, such as never has been since there was a nation till that time. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone whose name shall be found written in the book. And those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky above; and those who turn many to righteousness, like the stars forever and ever."

And I heard a loud voice in heaven, saying, "Now the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God and the authority of his Christ have come, for the accuser of our brothers has been thrown down, who accuses them day and night before our God. And they have conquered him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, for they loved not their lives even unto death. Therefore, rejoice, O heavens and you who dwell in them! But woe to you, O earth and sea, for the devil has come down to you in great wrath, because he knows that his time is short!"

At that time the disciples came to Jesus, saying, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" And calling to him a child, he put him in the midst of them and said, "Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.

"Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me, but whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone fastened around his neck and to be drowned in the depth of the sea.

"Woe to the world for temptations to sin! For it is necessary that temptations come, but woe to the one by whom the temptation comes! And if your hand or your foot causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life crippled or lame than with two hands or two feet to be thrown into the eternal fire. And if your eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into the hell of fire.

"See that you do not despise one of these little ones. For I tell you that in heaven their angels always see the face of my Father who is in heaven. For the Son of Man came to save the lost."

What Doctor Luther Says:

About the Deceit of the Wily Satan

Great is the astuteness in the power of Satan to deceive the senses. And no wonder, since a change of sense and of color can take place through glass. Therefore he can easily deceive a man with his wiles, so that the man supposes that he is seeing something that he really does not see, or hearing a voice, thunder, a flute, or a trumpet that he really does not hear. ... Thus Satan has uncommon ability to touch all the senses in such a way that you swear you see, hear, or feel something which you nevertheless do not see, etc.

But Satan does not dement men in this crude way only; he also does so in a way that is subtler and all the more dangerous. In this he is an especially clever trickster. This is why Paul applies the bewitchment of the senses to the bewitchment of the Spirit. But with the spiritual witchcraft that ancient serpent (Rev. 12:9) captures, not men's senses but their minds, and deceive them with false and wicked opinions; those who are bewitched in this way suppose that these opinions are true and godly. Nowadays he is showing his ability to do this in the fanatics, the Anabaptists, and the Sacramentarians. With his tricks he has so bewitched their minds that they are embracing lies, errors, and a horrible darkness as the most certain truth and the clearest light. They will not permit themselves to be dissuaded from these dreams of theirs by any admonitions or Scripture passages; for they are altogether persuaded that they alone are wise and have a pious attitude toward sacred things, and that everyone else is blind.

- ☐ 1 plastic soap box holder
- ☐ 1 toothbrush

- ☐ 1 sturdy comb
- ☐ 6 band-aids (½" or ¾")
- ☐ 1 small package facial tissues
- □ 1 nail clipper
- ☐ 1 piece of strong ribbon or cord

ASSEMBLY

- 1. Lay out the towel on a flat surface.
- 2. Fold over about 5" on each long side.
- 3. Place the rest of the items in the center under the folds.
- 4. Roll up the towel.
- Use ribbon or cord to tie the towel together in the middle.

PLEASE NOTE

- Dark colored linens are recommended.
- We recommend leaving contents in the original packaging, but it is not required.
- No additions, deletions, or substitutions.
- Do not add money, photos, or personal notes.
- Do not include items with religious, camouflage, patriotic or military symbols.
- Pack only new or gently used items.
- Do not include plastic bags.
- It costs an average of \$11 to ship each box of kits. Please consider a donation to your local OGT branch to help with shipping.
