RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those:

- (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;
- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;

(d) who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.



Upon this your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God unto all of you, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

The Congregation rises, turns towards the entrance of the nave, and faces the Cross of Christ, the reminder of Christ's promise to come and dwell among His people as they are gathered in His name.

Confession of Faith (The Athanasian Creed)

- *1* Whoever desires to be saved must, above all, hold the catholic faith.
- 2 Whoever does not keep it whole and undefiled will without doubt perish eternally.
- 3 And the catholic faith is this,
- 4 that we worship one God in trinity and Trinity in unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance.
- 5 For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is another.
- 6 But the Godhead of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit is one: the glory equal, the majesty coeternal.
- 7 Such as the Father is, such is the Son, and such is the Holy Spirit:
- 8 the Father uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated;
- 9 the Father infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite;
- 10 the Father eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal.
- 11 And yet there are not three Eternals, but one Eternal,
- 12 just as there are not three Uncreated or three Infinites, but one Uncreated and one Infinite.
- 13 In the same way, the Father is almighty, the Son almighty, the Holy Spirit almighty;
- 14 and yet there are not three Almighties but one Almighty.
- 15 So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God;
- 16 and yet there are not three Gods, but one God.
- 17 So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord;
- 18 and yet there are not three Lords, but one Lord.
- *19 Just as we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord,*
- 20 so also are we prohibited by the catholic religion to say that there are three Gods or Lords.
- 21 The Father is not made nor created nor begotten by anyone. The Son is neither made nor created, but begotten of the Father alone.
- 22 The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son, neither made nor created nor begotten but proceeding.
- 23 Thus, there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.
- 24 And in this Trinity none is before or after another; none is greater or less than another;
- 25 but the whole three persons are coeternal with each other so that in all things, as has been stated above, the Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity is to be worshiped.
- 26 Therefore, whoever desires to be saved must think thus about the Trinity.
- 27 But it is also necessary for everlasting salvation that one faithfully believe the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- 28 Therefore, it is the right faith that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is at the same time both God and man.
- 29 He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father before all ages; and He is man, born from the substance of His mother in this age:
- 30 perfect God and perfect man, composed of a rational soul and human flesh;
- *31* equal to the Father with respect to His divinity, less than the Father with respect to His humanity.
- 32 Although He is God and man, He is not two, but one Christ:
- *33* one, however, not by the conversion of the divinity into flesh but by the assumption of the humanity into God;
- 34 one altogether, not by confusion of substance, but by unity of person.
- 35 For as the rational soul and flesh is one man, so God and man is one Christ,
- 36 who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose again from the dead,
- 37 ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead.
- 38 At His coming all people will rise again with their bodies and give an account concerning their own deeds.
- *And those who have done good will enter into eternal life, and those who have done evil into eternal fire.*
- 40 This is the catholic faith; whoever does not believe it faithfully and firmly cannot be saved.

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Readings for the Festival of the Holy Trinity

The Old Testament Reading is Isaiah 6:1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!"

And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"

Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. And he touched my mouth and said: "Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for.

And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here am I! Send me."

The Second Reading is Acts 2:14a, 22-36

Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, ...

"Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that God did through him in your midst, as you yourselves know— this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it. For David says concerning him,

"I saw the Lord always before me,

for he is at my right hand that I may not be shaken;

therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced;

my flesh also will dwell in hope.

For you will not abandon my soul to Hades,

or let your Holy One see corruption.

You have made known to me the paths of life;

you will make me full of gladness with your presence.'

"Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. Being therefore a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would set one of his descendants on his throne, he foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh see corruption. This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing. For David did not ascend into the heavens, but he himself says,

"The Lord said to my Lord,

"Sit at my right hand,

until I make your enemies your footstool.""

Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified."

The Gospel is John 3:1-17

Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God." Nicodemus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit."

Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things? Truly, truly, I say to you, we speak of what we know, and bear witness to what we have seen, but you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except him who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life."

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."





What Doctor Luther Says:

About True Worship of the Thrice Holy God With two [wings the seraphim] flew. The angels were borne aloft like birds, that is, they served God not with their own endeavors, but with a confession in which they sing the Trishagion, that is, the thrice holy, whereby they indicate that all holiness in the whole earth must be ascribed to God alone. All the words are grandly put. They shouted. The truest worship of God is a pure and simple confession. God says (Ps. 50:23): "He who brings thanksgiving as his sacrifice honors Me." The other things we have, such as gifts, intellect, good habits, our best endeavors, let these be concealed. We must glory in the Word alone and confess that we have received these gifts from God, we do not bring them along. The ungodly regard God as defiled, though He alone is holy and makes holy. And yet they think that they are hallowing Him with a handful of incense, etc., which is the same as befouling Him. In short: God alone is holy, but the whole people and whatever the people do are completely defiled. To be sure, people agree to this statement according to the sound of the words, but when application is made of it by antithesis, they cannot endure it. Thus we say of ourselves: I am a sinner, unclean, defiled, etc., but we take it exceedingly amiss when others say it about us. It is necessary that God be hallowed and that I be defiled, but in that act of hallowing I must know, believe, praise, and confess that God Himself is alone holy, that He gives and does not receive. The glory be God's; the shame be ours. ... For us to glorify ourselves is to confuse ourselves with God and vice versa. ... But He Himself fills all things everywhere, wherever He pours out His gifts. The glory is therefore the confession which is due Him and which is paid Him in all the earth. Luther's Works, 16:70-71.

DEAR FELLOW SAINTS,

"Because you have made the Lord your dwelling place—the Most High, who is my refuge no evil shall be allowed to befall you, no plague come near your tent. For he will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways. On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone. You will tread on the lion and the adder; the young lion and the serpent you will trample underfoot. 'Because he holds fast to me in love, I will deliver him; I will protect him, because he knows my name. When he calls to me, I will answer him: I will be with him in trouble: I will rescue him and honor him. With long life I will satisfy him and show him my salvation." (PSALM 91:9-16)

In 1911, Winston Churchill faced a turning point in his career. He didn't know whether he would be promoted or fired. His wonderful wife, Clementine, told him he should not worry. That morning, she had come across these words in Psalm 107: "Some went down to the sea in ships, doing business on the great waters; they saw the deeds of the LORD, his wondrous works in the deep" (vv. 23–24).

Clementine was convinced that her husband would be appointed head of the Royal Navy - which he later was. A popular account from World War I tells of another psalm's long-standing connection to warfare. According to the story, a commander in the U.S. Army's 91st Infantry Division gave each of his soldiers a card with the 91st psalm printed on it. Soldiers took the cards into battle, hoping to be kept safe. When actor Jimmy Stewart enlisted in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II, his father gave him a letter and enclosed a copy of the same psalm. Over time, Psalm 91 has become known as the "Soldier's Psalm." Even in recent years, American troops in Iraq have been known to read it before going on patrol.

This is a comforting word of the Lord for our men and women of the Armed Forces. Our brave members of the Armed Forces stand firm against the enemies of our nation and defend the freedoms we hold dear. Yet, they and their families need your support to stand strong, to stand firm in the truth of their faith, and to be free to be faithful to their Lord while they serve in their vocations.

Through LCMS Ministry to the Armed Forces, we continue to provide Gospel-centered resources to those who selflessly serve and have served our nation. This makes it possible for them to stand in the shadow of the Almighty and proclaim that the Lord is their refuge and fortress in whom they can trust. Our service members have answered the call to defend our freedoms. It is now our turn to give them the spiritual resources they need.

These are challenging times on many fronts. Yet knowing there are people like you people who have their back with prayers and financial support — is a blessing to them and to us. We are committed to providing pastoral care to our LCMS chaplains and their families while they serve our nation, often in austere and dangerous conditions.
