RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those:

- (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;
- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.

The Congregation rises, turns towards the entrance of the nave, and faces the Cross of Christ, the reminder of Christ's promise to come and dwell among His people as they are gathered in His name.




Pastoral Address for the Beginning of Lent

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ: ...

Let us humble ourselves before God, confess our sins to Him, and implore His forgiveness.

confess unto You all my sins and iniquities with which I have ever offended You and justly deserved Your temporal and eternal punishment. But I am heartily sorry for them and sincerely repent of them, and I pray You of Your boundless mercy and for the sake of the holy, innocent, bitter sufferings and death of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, to be gracious and merciful to me, a poor, sinful being. Forgive me all my sins and grant me the assistance of God the Holy Spirit that I may amend my sinful life. Imposition of Ashes and Individual Absolution [Be seated.] At this point, in the history of the Church's liturgy, the faithful approached the altar, and kneeling, received the imposition of ashes, accompanied by the words: "Remember, O man, that you are dust, and to dust you shall return!" We pause, at this time, to meditate in song and silence on the sobering thought of our own mortality due to sin. Those who wish to come forward and receive the ashes may do so at this time, at the usher's direction. This year, we will stand to have the ashes imposed, after which you may be seated until the imposition of ashes is completed. Then we stand again for prayer.] In the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the \(\pm\) Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen! Readings for Ash Wednesday

The Old Testament Reading is Joel 2:12-19

"Yet even now," declares the LORD, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning;

and rend your hearts and not your garments."

Return to the LORD your God, for he is gracious and merciful,

slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love;

and he relents over disaster.

Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him,

a grain offering and a drink offering for the LORD your God?

Blow the trumpet in Zion; consecrate a fast;

call a solemn assembly; gather the people.

Consecrate the congregation; assemble the elders;

gather the children, even nursing infants.

Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her chamber.

Between the vestibule and the altar

let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep

and say, "Spare your people, O LORD,

and make not your heritage a reproach,

a byword among the nations.

Why should they say among the peoples, 'Where is their God?'"

Then the LORD became jealous for his land

and had pity on his people.

The LORD answered and said to his people,

"Behold, I am sending to you grain, wine, and oil,

and you will be satisfied;

and I will no more make you a reproach among the nations."

The Epistle is 2 Corinthians 5:20b-6:10

We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. For he says,

"In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you." Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

The Gospel is Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

[Jesus said,] "Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven.

"Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your giving may be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

"And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. ...

"And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

What Doctor Luther Says:

About God's Grace and Gifts

10. Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit in my inwards.

We have finished the main part of this psalm, which deals with the principal doctrines of our religion, namely: What is repentance? What is sin? What is grace? What is justification? What are the causes of justification? The following section seems to me to pertain to the gifts of the Spirit that follow the forgiveness of sins. Paul maintains this distinction, that grace is one thing and the gift is another (Rom. 5:15). Grace means the favor by which God accepts us, forgiving sins and justifying freely through Christ. It belongs to the category of relationship, which the dialecticians say has a minimum of entity and a maximum of power. So you should not think it is a quality, as the scholastics dreamed. The forgiveness of sins depends simply on the promise which faith accepts – not on our works or merits, but on the fact that by the sting of the Law God graciously calls us back to Himself so that we might acknowledge Him to be the giver of grace. The gift or the χαρίσματα are what is given to the believers after the forgiveness of sins by the God reconciled through Christ. In my judgment, the next three verses pertain to these gifts. I take them to be joined because three times he repeats the name of the Spirit: "right Spirit," "holy Spirit," and "princely Spirit."
