- who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. 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Readings for the Third Sunday after the Epiphany

The Old Testament Reading is Nehemiah 8:1-3, 5-6, 8-10

All the people gathered as one man into the square before the Water Gate. And they told Ezra the scribe to bring the Book of the Law of Moses that the LORD had commanded Israel. So Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, both men and women and all who could understand what they heard, on the first day of the seventh month. And he read from it facing the square before the Water Gate from early morning until midday, in the presence of the men and the women and those who could understand. And the ears of all the people were attentive to the Book of the Law. ...

And Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, for he was above all the people, and as he opened it all the people stood. And Ezra blessed the LORD, the great God, and all the people answered, "Amen, Amen," lifting up their hands. And they bowed their heads and worshiped the LORD with their faces to the ground. ...

They read from the book, from the Law of God, clearly, and they gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading.

And Nehemiah, who was the governor, and Ezra the priest and scribe, and the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, "This day is holy to the LORD your God; do not mourn or weep." For all the people wept as they heard the words of the Law. Then he said to them, "Go your way. Eat the fat and drink sweet wine and send portions to anyone who has nothing ready, for this day is holy to our Lord. And do not be grieved, for the joy of the LORD is your strength."

The Epistle is 1 Corinthians 12:12-31a

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and all were made to drink of one Spirit.

For the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would be the sense of hearing? If the whole body were an ear, where would be the sense of smell? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, yet one body.

The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." On the contrary, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and on those parts of the body that we

think less honorable we bestow the greater honor, and our unpresentable parts are treated with greater modesty, which our more presentable parts do not require. But God has so composed the body, giving greater honor to the part that lacked it, that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together.

Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healing, helping, administrating, and various kinds of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak with tongues? Do all interpret? But earnestly desire the higher gifts.

The Gospel is Luke 4:16-30

[Jesus] came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up. And as was his custom, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and he stood up to read. And the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written,

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,
because he has anointed me
to proclaim good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives
and recovering of sight to the blind,
to set at liberty those who are oppressed,
to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

And he rolled up the scroll and gave it back to the attendant and sat down. And the eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. And he began to say to them, "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." And all spoke well of him and marveled at the gracious words that were coming from his mouth. And they said, "Is not this Joseph's son?" And he said to them, "Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, 'Physician, heal yourself.' What we have heard you did at Capernaum, do here in your hometown as well." And he said, "Truly, I say to you, no prophet is acceptable in his hometown. But in truth, I tell you, there were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah, when the heavens were shut up three years and six months, and a great famine came over all the land, and Elijah was sent to none of them but only to Zarephath, in the land of Sidon, to a woman who was a widow. And there were many lepers in Israel in the time of the prophet Elisha, and none of them was cleansed, but only Naaman the Syrian." When they heard these things, all in the synagogue were filled with wrath. And they rose up and drove him out of the town and brought him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they could throw him down the cliff. But passing through their midst, he went away.



What Doctor Luther Says:

About Rightly Understanding of the Law of God

[Psalm 119:]34. Give me understanding, and I will search Thy law, and I will keep it with my whole heart. Thus Ps. 32:9 says: "Be not like a horse and a mule, which have no understanding." For first He offered: "I will give you understanding and instruct you in the way you should go" (Ps. 32:8). Therefore understanding is from the Lord alone, as He says: "They will all be taught of God" (John 6:45). Therefore this understanding is not possessed by the philosophers, nor is it natural, namely, an understanding by which we also observe visible things, but it is theological and granted by grace, an understanding by which through faith we contemplate things that do not appear. Therefore He is called the "Spirit of wisdom and understanding" (Is. 11:2). When we have Him, we can correctly search the Law, that is, in depth seek out what it contains in the spirit. The Gospel gives understanding by means of which the old law is revealed and studied. Without it those who search fail in their search, as indicated above in verse 2.

But this law cannot be kept except with the whole heart. Hence in the old law and in the prophets God often commands that He be worshiped and that His law be kept with the whole heart, even though that law could not grant this, because it was the letter. And yet He commanded it, so that people might long for Christ and pray for its fulfillment. Just as even now He commands that He be loved perfectly, even though this cannot be done in this life, in order to compel us to long for the future life, in which we will fulfill all of this.

Summary of meeting of the Council of Elders, January 2, 2025

(The following summary is being provided in accordance with the congregation's bylaws, §VIII)

Attendance:

Elders present: R. Lammert (chairman), A. Litke (secretary), F.

Jackson, W. Krause, T. Muehl.

Elders absent: K. Vlot. Pastor present: Pr. Punke.

Pastor Punke led the elders in a devotion by reading Articles V and VI of the Augsburg Confession.

In his pastor's report, Pastor Punke reported on various matters: the death of John Starks, the move of the Divine Service to Bauer Hall during the rebeautification of the sanctuary, the completed Christmas programs of LSUS and CLHS, and the proposed policy of tor the Erwin Brand Scholarship that will be presented to the Education Comm ittee.

The elders reviewed Pillar 1, Goal #1: "Starting January 1, 2025, Zion will experience a 10% increase in average worship attendance by March 31, 2025." Pastor Punke previewed a list of members who have missed four consecutive Divine Services on Sundays (or Wednesdays). He noted that there are names on the list of those whose circumstances are known to him, and thus would not warrant a phone call. Pastor Punke will continue to work on it, divide the list among the elders, and send it to them for phone calls.

The elders reviewed Pillar 2, Goal #1: "In January of 2025, Zion will commence an annual opportunity for providing resources and training for members to gain confidence in inviting neighbors to Zion." The elders continued planning for this program. Beginning on January 26, Zion will again offer the six sessions of the *Every One His Witness* workshop, meeting after the Divine Service. Pastor Punke will be facilitating the sessions.

The elders reviewed Pillar 2, Goal #4: "The Council of Elders will conduct the CADDS survey before Lent 2025." The elders will be using a tool developed by The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod to survey congregational members and others who have a stake in the congregation. The Congregational Assessment of Development/Decline Status (CADDS) survey will give congregational leaders a view of what members see as the areas in which Zion is strong, as well as those in which Zion is weak. This survey should provide useful data to church leaders for future planning. The survey is primarily an online tool (although we will provide a paper copy of the survey to anyone who is unable or unwilling to use an online form) that will be open for use on February 9.

The elders continued to review the document of the Council of Elders on Communion Procedure. The review will be continued in the February meeting.

The meeting was concluded with the praying of Compline.
