RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those:

- (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit,
- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
 - who sincerely repent of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal.

Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.

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The Congregation rises, turns towards the entrance of the nave, and faces the Cross of Christ, the reminder of Christ's promise to come and dwell among His people as they are gathered in His name.

The Old Testament Reading is Genesis 18:1-14

The LORD appeared to [Abraham] by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the door of his tent in the heat of the day. He lifted up his eyes and looked, and behold, three men were standing in front of him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent door to meet them and bowed himself to the earth and said, "O Lord, if I have found favor in your sight, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree, while I bring a morsel of bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant." So they said, "Do as you have said." And Abraham went quickly into the tent to Sarah and said, "Quick! Three seahs of fine flour! Knead it, and make cakes." And Abraham ran to the herd and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to a young man, who prepared it quickly. Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared, and set it before them. And he stood by them under the tree while they ate.

They said to him, "Where is Sarah your wife?" And he said, "She is in the tent." The LORD said, "I will surely return to you about this time next year, and Sarah your wife shall have a son." And Sarah was listening at the tent door behind him. Now Abraham and Sarah were old, advanced in years. The way of women had ceased to be with Sarah. So Sarah laughed to herself, saying, "After I am worn out, and my lord is old, shall I have pleasure?" The LORD said to Abraham, "Why did Sarah laugh and say, 'Shall I indeed bear a child, now that I am old?' Is anything too hard for the LORD? At the appointed time I will return to you about this time next year, and Sarah shall have a son."

The Epistle is Colossians 1:21-29

You, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him, if indeed you continue in the faith, stable and steadfast, not shifting from the hope of the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed in all creation under heaven, and of which I, Paul, became a minister.

Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church, of which I became a minister according to the stewardship from God that was given to me for you, to make the word

of God fully known, the mystery hidden for ages and generations but now revealed to his saints. To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. Him we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone mature in Christ. For this I toil, struggling with all his energy that he powerfully works within me.

Now as they went on their way, Jesus entered a village. And a woman named Martha welcomed him into her house. And she had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to his teaching. But Martha was distracted with much serving. And she went up to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Tell her then to help me." But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things, but one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the good portion, which will not be taken away from her."

What Doctor Luther Says:

About Trusting in God's Prevenient Promises

6. If man is to deal with God and receive anything from him, it must happen in this manner, not that man begins and lays the first stone, but that God alone—without any entreaty or desire of man—must first come and give him a promise. This word of God is the beginning, the foundation, the rock, upon which afterward all works, words, and thoughts of man must build. This word man must gratefully accept. He must faithfully believe the divine promise and by no means doubt that it is and comes to pass just as God promises. This trust and faith is the beginning, middle, and end of all works and righteousness. For because man does God the honor of regarding and confessing him as true, he becomes to man a gracious God, who in turn honors man and regards and confesses him as true. Thus it is not possible that a man, of his own reason and strength, should by works ascend to heaven, anticipating God and moving him to be gracious. On the contrary God must anticipate all [of man's] works and thoughts, and make a promise clearly expressed in words, which man then takes and keeps in a good, firm faith.

Then there follows the Holy Spirit, who is given to man for the sake of this same faith.

7. Such a promise was given to Adam after his fall, when God spoke to the serpent [Gen. 3:15] ... God summoned Abraham out of his fatherland and promised him that by his descendants all nations should be blessed [Gen. 22:18]. This promise Abraham believed and obeyed and thereby was justified and became a friend of God [Gen. 15:6]. In the same book this promise to Abraham is cited significantly and repeatedly, enlarged, and clarified, until Isaac is promised to him [Gen. 18:10-14], who was to be the seed from which Christ and every blessing should come. Abraham's children were kept in this faith in God's promise until the time of Christ ...

Summary of meeting of the Council of Elders, July 10, 2025 (The following summary is being provided in accordance with the congregation's bylaws, §VIII)

Attendance:

Elders present: R. Lammert (chairman), A. Litke (secretary), W. Krause, F. Jackson. J. Teasdale, K. Vlot.

Elder absent: T. Muehl. Pastor (absent): Pr. Punke.

Richard Lammert led the elders in a devotion by continuing the reading of Article V of the Apology of the Augsburg Confes-sion.

The elders reviewed Pillar 1, Goal #1: "Starting July 1, 2025, Zion will experience a 10% increase in average worship atten-dance by September 30, 2025." The elders will wait until Pastor Punke has had the opportunity to prepare a list of the longer-term inactive members (those with an absence longer than four Sundays) before considering ways to contact them.

The elders reviewed Pillar 2, Goal #1: "In January of 2025, Zion will commence an annual opportunity for providing re-sources and training for members to gain confidence in inviting neighbors to Zion." The elders will schedule the start of the Every One His Witness workshop in September or the first part of October, in order to finish the six sessions before the begin-ning of Advent. The exact day and time will be decided in the August meeting when Pastor Punke can present choices for dates that will work best on the church calendar.

The elders reviewed Pillar 2, Goal #4: "The Council of Elders will work through an ad-hoc committee with the Administrative Council and Education Council to determine whether to pro-ceed and how to proceed to respond to the results of the CADDS survey, with a report by September 30, 2025." All members have been appointed: from the Council of Elders, Frank Jackson and Kurt Vlot; from the Education Council, Rev. Mike Bahr; from the Administrative Council, Ned Hollman and Mark Muehl. The ad-hoc committee has not yet met; Frank Jackson, acting as convener and chairman, will preside over the work of the committee.

CADDS survey, with a report by September 30, 2025." All members have been appointed: from the Council of Elders, Frank Jackson and Kurt Vlot; from the Education Council, Rev. Mike Bahr; from the Administrative Council, Ned Hollman and Mark Muehl. The ad-hoc committee has not yet met; Frank Jackson, acting as convener and chairman, will preside over the work of the committee.

In accordance with congregational bylaws, §V.D, the elders reviewed and approved by a voice vote the proposed slate of candidates for the congregational meeting on August 3.

The elders began reviewing and amending the congregational document *The Wedding Service at Zion*, last updated on August 8, 2015.

The meeting was closed by praying Responsive Prayer 1.
