
RECEIVING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER AT ZION

As intended by Christ and as practiced by the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church throughout her history, "Closed Communion" is observed in this congregation, in which the Lord's Supper is distributed only to those:

- (a) who have been **baptized** in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit;
- (b) who have been instructed in the truth of Holy Scripture as taught in the Lutheran Confessions, who have been confirmed in this Lutheran faith, and who now confess the same doctrines that are taught in this congregation, holding membership in a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod;
- (c) who believe that in this sacrament the real body and blood of Christ are truly distributed to them and orally received by them, bestowing on them the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation;
- (d) who **sincerely repent** of all their sins, and desire to receive God's forgiveness in this holy meal. Guests at our services, before receiving the sacrament, are requested to affirm these facts with one of our pastors. Thank you for honoring our practice. If you are looking for a church home, would like to be a member of Zion, or would like to learn more about the Christian Faith, please speak to one of our pastors about our membership classes.



The Old Testament Reading is Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4

The oracle that Habakkuk the prophet saw.

The Epistle is 2 Timothy 1:1-14

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God according to the promise of the life that is in Christ Jesus,

To Timothy, my beloved child:

Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord

I thank God whom I serve, as did my ancestors, with a clear conscience, as I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. As I remember your tears, I long to see you, that I may be filled with

joy. I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, dwells in you as well. For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands, for God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control.

Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel by the power of God, who saved us and called us to a holy calling, not because of our works but because of his own purpose and grace, which he gave us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, and which now has been manifested through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel, for which I was appointed a preacher and apostle and teacher, which is why I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed, and I am convinced that he is able to guard until that Day what has been entrusted to me. Follow the pattern of the sound words that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. By the Holy Spirit who dwells within us, guard the good deposit entrusted to you.

The Gospel is Luke 17:1-10

[Jesus] said to his disciples, "Temptations to sin are sure to come, but woe to the one through whom they come! It would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck and he were cast into the sea than that he should cause one of these little ones to sin. Pay attention to yourselves! If your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, forgive him, and if he sins against you seven times in the day, and turns to you seven times, saying, 'I repent,' you must forgive him."

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!" And the Lord said, "If you had faith like a grain of mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you.

"Will any one of you who has a servant plowing or keeping sheep say to him when he has come in from the field, 'Come at once and sit down at table'? Will he not rather say to him, 'Prepare supper for me, and dress properly, and serve me while I eat and drink, and afterward you will eat and drink'? Does he thank the servant because he did what was commanded? So you also, when you have done all that you were commanded, say, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done what was our duty."



What Doctor Luther Says:

About the Futility of Works; Salvation Is by Faith

Again, just as [Jesus] firmly stands against the "works-righteous" ones, without yielding an inch, so he also stands up for all who put their trust in him, as Isaiah 28[:16] says: "I shall lay a cornerstone for a foundation, and all who believe in him, shall not come to shame." And Christ himself says in Matthew 16[:18]: "On that rock will I build my church and the hellish portals shall not overpower it." The falling and breaking mentioned here is nothing else than unbelief and clinging to works, even as rising and being built on this rock is nothing else than faith and disregarding works. This takes place for the believers, for whom Christ alone is set for a rising.

Even as at the time of Christ many in Israel rose in him, so it will continue until the end of the world; nobody can rise through works or through the teachings of men, but solely through Christ. This comes to pass through faith, as has often been stated, without any works and merit; works must of necessity come after we have risen.

You see how the entire Bible speaks only of faith and rejects works as useless, indeed as offensive and as an obstacle to righteousness and our own rising. Christ alone wants to be set up for the rising of many; otherwise he becomes the reason for their fall.

He does not permit anything to be set next to him to bring about our rising. Is the life of the papists and the clergy not horrible?

They run against this rock so vehemently and directly, and their walk is so utterly opposed to the Christian life, that it may well be called the Antichrist's nature and rule. Of this rising does the spiritual Simeon speak to Christ's spiritual mother. For all the prophets teach Christendom that only in Christ can all men rise, as St. Paul says in Romans 1[:17], and Hebrews 10[:38] quotes Habakkuk 2[:4]: "The righteous man lives by his faith." *Luther's Works*, 52:113-14.

So far this year, the Planned Parenthood abortion business has closed 41 centers. Despite what the abortion giant and the media would have Americans think, they all participated in abortions. Some would kill babies directly with surgical abortions. Others would kill babies by selling the dangerous abortion pill that also kills and injures women. Still others would make abortion referrals -with Planned Parenthood locations in pro-life states arranging abortions in other states or using telehealth to sell abortion pills to women in violation of state pro-life laws ... The closures don't mean that every baby the Planned Parenthood center would have killed will be saved. The abortion business is desperate for cash from killing babies—so it will make every effort to sell women abortions over the phone or internet. But for some babies and some women, lives will be spared because a physical Planned Parenthood location is not available. "Life is winning," Majorie Dannenfelser, president of the Susan B. Anthony (SBA) Pro-life America. "Imagine how many more will shut down once they stop receiving half a billion dollars in Medicaid money. By Planned Parenthood's own account, our victory stopping the forced taxpayer funding of abortion businesses could cause up to 200 facilities to close." 


Speaking up For Life

God's Wonderfully Comforting Promises

od's Word tells us that it is a blessing to grow to an old age (Job 12:12; Proverbs 16:31, 17:6). However, because of sin, growing old also comes with many challenges. For many, aging means having to deal with a weakening and aching body, forgetfulness, and the loss of independence, among many other frustrations.

Unfortunately, the devil has convinced our culture to look to death as the solution to the suffering that comes with growing old. The story of Genesis 3 has been repeated over and again as people elevate themselves to the place of God, who alone has authority over life and death. Ending one's own life through physician-assisted suicide or purposely hastening death by withholding necessary medications or treatments are violations of God's command to love and protect the lives He so wonderfully created.

It is right for a Christian to feel compassion for those who suffer and to desire an end to their pain. But deliberately ending a life is not the answer. Christ alone provides the answer to our suffering by joining Himself to our suffering in His own life and death.

For the sake of Christ, the heavenly Father leaves the aging with many wonderfully comforting promises. God will never leave us or forsake us, no matter how old we grow or how terribly we suffer (Isaiah 46:4; Psalm 138:9). He will use our suffering to strengthen our faith and bring us into His salvation (Romans 5:3-5, 8:28-30). And finally, by patiently enduring our suffering through the faith that He supplies, God will ultimately free us from all pain and suffering (Isaiah 25:8; Revelation 2:10).

May your faith be increased so that in Christ our Lord, you are able both to see the sanctity that God places upon the lives of the aged and to entrust yourself into the loving care of our Father in heaven no matter what lies ahead, knowing that "even to your old age I am he, and to gray hairs I will carry you. I have made, and I will bear; I will carry and will save" (Isaiah 46:4).
